One: All around us are the sights and sounds of Christmas, Gentle God: the laughter of parties, the songs of carolers, the shouts of children, the music in every store. But deep within us we—or someone we love—carry pain. In this time when night can stretch into eternity, we come to you, bringing our gifts; not gold, frankincense and myrrh, but our prayers, our hope, and our grief.

All: **We have come from different backgrounds, from different families, from different faith traditions. But we all know what it is like to feel like we are wandering in “the far country”—far from You and far from Your peace.**

One: In a season when so many people don't have enough hours in the day to get their lists checked off, their cards mailed, their presents wrapped, many of us feel like we have TOO much time—time to grieve over a job, a dream, or a loved one.

All: **Our fear of the future, our remembrance of the past, our pain that is difficult to bear and harder to release, our emptiness which cannot be filled with platitudes: all can make this a season of long nights.**

One: Be with us, O God. Be with all of us in our loneliness, in our longing, in our hopes and fears, in our lives. Be with us and with those we love—those we hold in our hearts. Be with us and hear us as we pray with Jesus.

All: **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.**
