SO GREAT A SALVATION (Hebrews 4:11-13)

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**Main Point:** *Strive to enter God's rest, because the Word that searches you belongs to the God to whom you must give an \_\_\_\_\_.*

1. Strive toward the rest that still \_\_\_\_\_. (v. 11)

2. Let the Word search your \_\_\_\_\_. (v. 12)

3. Remember that nothing is \_\_\_\_\_ from God. (v.13)

4. Run to your great \_\_\_\_\_. (v. 14)

*Our goal every weekend is that you (1) understand the Bible better, (2) get some ideas about how to live your life in light of the Bible, and (3) stand in greater awe of Jesus.*

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# Growth Questions

These questions are to help you apply each week's message to your life and to help others do the same. Can being honest and vulnerable about your life be intimidating? Is it OK to struggle and have real questions? The answer to both questions is "Yes." Growth Groups are meant to be safe places where we share our answers to the questions below in order to help people know, love & serve Jesus better, together. - 1. Hebrews 3:18 says Israel failed to enter because of disobedience. Hebrews 3:19 says they failed because of unbelief. Why does the writer name the same failure two different ways, and which one would the people around them have been able to see?*
- 2. The sermon argued that the writer proves the Word is living rather than merely asserting it, pointing to Hebrews 3:37 and 4:7. Read those two verses. What does it change about your Bible reading this week if the Author has never stopped talking?*
- 3. Verse 12 says the Word discerns "the thoughts and intentions of the heart," not the actions. Name something a person could do that looks obedient from the outside but could be driven by two completely different motives. Why can no one else in the room tell the difference?*
- 4. The sermon named a common misuse of verse 12: quoting it to prove Scripture's power or to correct someone else's error, rather than standing under it. Where have you used the Bible as a sword pointed outward? What would it look like this week to lie down under it instead?*
- 5. Verse 13 leaves every person naked and exposed, and verse 14 immediately answers with a great High Priest. Adam's instinct after being exposed was to hide. What does hiding from God actually look like in the life of a Christian who has not stopped attending, serving, or reading?*
