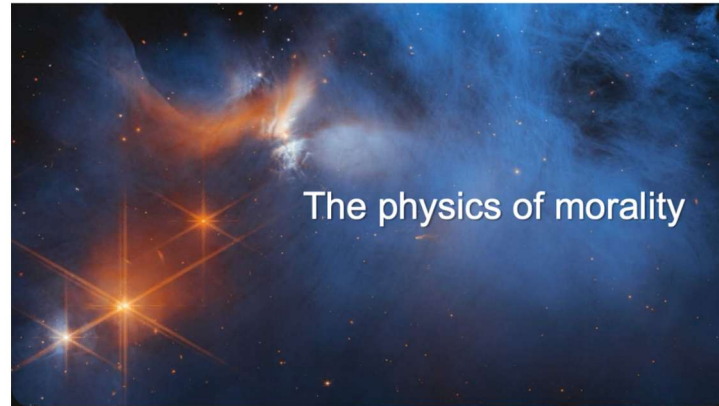

Bertrand Russell, "The Free Man's Worship," *The Independent Review*, Dec 1903:

"Man is the product of causes which had no prevision of the end they were achieving, ... his origin, his growth, his hopes and fears, his loves and his beliefs are but the outcome of accidental concoctions of atoms, ... no fire, no heroism, no intensity of thought and feeling can preserve an individual life beyond the grave, and all the labor of the ages, all the devotion, all of the inspiration, all the noonday brightness of human genius are destined to extinction in the vast death of the solar system. The whole temple of man's achievement must inevitably be buried beneath the debris of a universe in ruins. All these things, if not quite beyond dispute, are yet so nearly certain that no philosophy that rejects them can hope to stand. Only within the scaffolding of these truths, only on the firm foundation of unyielding despair can the soul's habitation henceforth be safely built. The best way to overcome [death] - so at least it seems to me - is to make your interests gradually wider and more impersonal, until bit by bit the walls of the ego recede, and your life becomes increasingly merged in the universal life. The man who, in old age, can see his life in this way, will not suffer from the fear of death."
