We see there's always something to be thankful for, in any situation. God knows the plan, so we just wait and lean into him. We pray it will be a testimony of Gods power and goodness. The medical staff have been amazed by how smoothly it's gone so far. They have said wonderful things about Jeffrey. He is funny and cooperates well, which makes procedures move faster, taking away any addition stress or trauma he would have experienced. The oncologist said that Jeffrey is looking and doing better at this stage than what he usually sees. We are humbled by that. God is so good. The nausea has been under control, and he's maintained a good weight. Many of the prayers needed in the previous letter cover long-term effects. We are continuing to pray for those and for Jeffrey to have strength during the next round.
