Sermon Notes: May 21 & May 24, 2026

Acts 2 tells the story of Pentecost. Pentecost is a holy day in the church when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, the formation or birthday of the Church, and the empowerment of Christ followers. Did you hear the story? The faithful were gathered in the Upper Room, waiting as Jesus had instructed them to do. Suddenly the Holy Spirit, sounding like a rushing wind came and tongues of fire resting upon them. They were given gifts of God’s Spirit, including the ability to speak in different languages and understand different languages. All got chaotic and the gathering spilled into the streets. Peter started preaching, those from out of town who were in Jerusalem for a religious festival could understand Peter, because of the gift of different languages. Three thousand people heard the Good News and were converted that day. (Acts 2:1-21).

One of the many gifts and blessings of the day was people from different regions who gathered in Jerusalem for worship, were brought together in understanding by the Holy Spirit. The Spirit continues to bring God’s people. Thanks to the Spirit, we who are different are One in Jesus. Through the Spirit, our many gifts make up the church. In the Spirit, we can love our neighbor as ourselves. This week give thanks to God for the unifying grace that comes through the Holy Spirit.

Summer Devotional Suggestions

“You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with all your heart.” – Jeremiah 29:13

As our regular Wednesday morning Bible Study and Wednesday Night Small Groups take a break for the summer months, we encourage you to continue nurturing your walk with the Lord in simple, meaningful ways. Whether you are at home or traveling, these ideas are meant to help you stay connected to God at your own pace.

1. Spend Time in Scripture

Choose a simple focus for the summer, such as the Psalms or the parables of Jesus. Read a short passage each day or week, asking: What does this teach me about God? How can I respond?

2. Take Your Devotional Time Outdoors

Use the beauty of summer as a reminder of God’s presence. Sit on a porch, walk in a park, or pause during your day to reflect on His creation and give thanks.

3. Keep It Simple and Consistent

Set aside a few quiet moments each day or a longer time once or twice a week. Even a brief time in prayer and Scripture can be deeply meaningful.

4. Pray with Intention

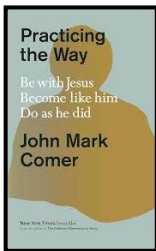
Use this season to focus on prayer. Pray for your family, your church, and specific needs in our community. Consider keeping a short list to guide your prayers.

5. Practice Gratitude

Each day, take a moment to thank God for specific blessings. Writing them down in a journal can help you see His faithfulness over time.

Wednesday morning Bible study and Wonderful Wednesday Small Groups resume in August.

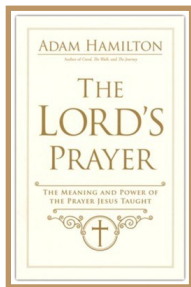

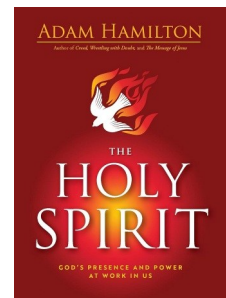
The Lord’s Prayer *The Meaning & Power of the Prayer* by Adam Hamilton

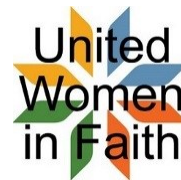

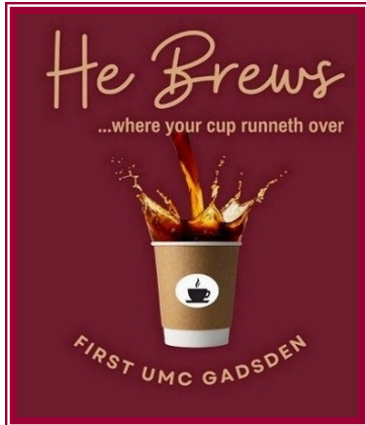
DO YOU KNOW?

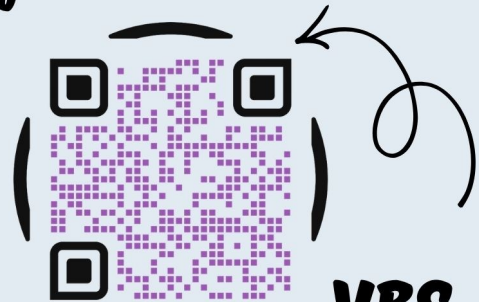
