Leadership Commitment

In the same way, [those who want to be servants in the church] are to be worthy of respect, sincere, not indulging in much wine, and not pursuing dishonest gain. They must keep hold of the deep truths of the faith with a clear conscience. They must first be tested; and then if there is nothing against them, let them serve as deacons. - By providing an example in speech and action, we encourage others to grow in Christ. This is a way of life measured by our heart and commitment, and we should regard it as an essential part of our development, not as an imposition or restriction.
