## 2026 Trip Recap

### **University Outreach in Kaohsiung & Yunlin:**

We kicked off the trip at a weekend camp in Kaohsiung, living and playing alongside college students. This built a foundation of trust that followed us back to their campuses in Yunlin. Throughout the week, we held "American Meal Nights" with home-cooked food and English worship songs paired with American Sign Language. The highlight was our team's personal testimonies; sharing how Christ transformed our lives helped students realize that God's love is both unconditional and borderless. Many students even opened their hearts to accept Jesus as their Savior during our one-on-one prayer times.

### **Serving the Next Generation:**

In the afternoons, we served at local elementary school after-school programs. The children were full of curiosity and joy as they learned to sing "Jesus Loves Me" in English. We also spent time with toddlers and their mothers, using simple English and song to plant early seeds of faith.

### **Women's Ministry:**

We also had the chance to visit the knitting class hosted by the church for young women. In an environment where most had never heard the Gospel, our sisters shared powerful stories of encountering God in their youth, leaving the women deeply moved and eager for a future visit.

### **Taipei Youth & Children:**

Moving from the multiple ghost worship frontiers of Yunlin to the bustling capital of Taipei, our focus shifted. Working with local churches, we moved from "introducing" Jesus to teaching Christian youth about the power of the Holy Spirit and the meaning of being born again. For the younger children, we focused on breaking the cycle of digital distractions (TV/games) by rooting their identity in God's love.

### **A Transformed Team**

This mission was about more than just reaching the 97.1% of Taiwan that does not yet know Christ. It was a journey of internal growth. We began as strangers and returned as a "spiritual army"—a unified body that supported, cared for, and prayed for one another.

While we went to share God's love with the people of Taiwan, we returned with our own hearts more deeply consecrated to Him. We know that while we planted and watered the seeds, it is God who will provide the growth. To Him be the glory!
