



"10 Tweets" from Ephesians 2

1. While Ephesians 1 ended with a clear focus on Christ, Ephesians 2 begins with a clear focus on YOU! Who you were without Christ and who you've become in Christ. This chapter is about understanding the **believer's position in the household of God**. (Eph. 2:1-5)
2. The world has a "course," a way of living. It's engineered by the "prince of the power of the air," (the Devil) to keep you focused on your flesh and your desires. It results in wrath, death and hopelessness. (Eph. 2:2-3)
3. For any who would receive it, the blood of Jesus Christ QUICKENS (makes alive) and takes you OUT of the world's system and places you IN the household of God. (Eph. 2:4-5, 19)
4. While believers are the undeserving benefactors of God's grace, He is doing it purposefully: to put on full display His glory and grace for all of heaven to see, even our adversary, that old serpent the Devil, and the "sons of God" who first rebelled against God. (Eph. 2:6-7; Ez. 28:11-16)
5. Just in case there are any lingering questions whatsoever in the mind of a believer, God double-underlines and highlights **how a soul gets saved**: by HIS GRACE through OUR FAITH in the blood that has already been shed. There is NOTHING (not one thing!) a person can do to save themselves. Jesus has already done it all and is offering it as a **free gift** to anyone who will accept it. That is God's grace! (Eph. 2:8-9)
6. The reason we are still here on Earth after we get saved is because, now that we are in Christ, we've got work to do down here – His work! In our salvation, God equipped us for that work with the Spirit. (Eph. 2:10)
7. Don't forget where you came from. As a believer, remember that you were once lost and a stranger from God. The only thing that made you **accepted** and brought you **peace** is the blood of Christ. (Eph. 2:11-14)
8. Don't forget who you are. The only thing special about you is that you're now in Christ – and that's pretty special! Through Christ, God has taken different peoples (Jew and Gentile) and placed them in one body, "one new man, so making peace." And now we have equal access to the Father in the Spirit – 24/7/365! (Eph. 2:15-18)
9. We are a part of something bigger than ourselves. Ephesians 2 reveals we are all stones in a building built on one foundation: Christ. This is the "house" God has always sought to dwell in: us! (Eph. 2:19-22)
10. Though saved, we still have two natures: the "old man," and the "new man." The one we choose to walk in each day will declare to all the world (and to all of Heaven based on verses 6-7) how we esteem our position in Christ – whether we lightly esteem it or highly esteem it.
