

1. Where have you seen God this week?
2. A story was shared about a moment when the preacher was relieved of the consequences through grace. Can you recall a moment in your life when someone extended grace to you, even though you didn't deserve it?
3. We defined the spiritual fruit of kindness as, *"a quality which is so kind that it is always eager to give whatever gift may be necessary."* What does this definition mean to you? How would you describe kindness? How can we begin making kindness a daily lifestyle?
4. Paul wrote this letter to Titus so that he would be able to share the Gospel with a corrupt group of people. Are there people in your life who need to hear the Gospel? How can we begin sharing the Gospel with those around us who need it?
5. Read **Titus 3:1–2** together. Paul specifically tells believers to be "peaceable, compassionate," and more. Based on the defined fruit of kindness, what are some ways you can begin extending kindness to others in your daily life?
6. Read **Titus 3:3–8** together. Paul talks about who we used to be, but once the kindness of God appeared, all of that was washed away. How does God's mercy and grace in your life make you feel? Why do you think God extended kindness toward people who didn't accept Him? Remembering who we were helps us become more compassionate toward others. How are you practicing compassion in your life?
7. In **Titus 3:8**, Paul talks about "devoting yourself to doing what is good." How do you interpret that passage? We talked about how the fruit of kindness needs a place to express itself. How is the fruit of kindness expressing itself in your life? Are you devoting yourself to good works?
8. Lastly, we discussed how God desires us to be unified. Are you practicing unity in your lifestyle? If so, how can you encourage others in your life to also practice unity.
