

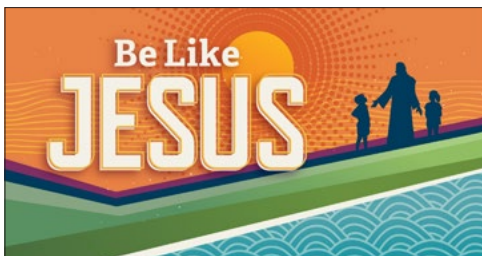
In God's Big Story

FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- Do you think having faith in God matters? Why or why not?
- If we made a list of all the ways God has been faithful and good, what would be on our list?

Growing Faith

Younger Kids!

Kids love to watch things grow! Give your child a front row seat to Hebrews 11:1 by planting a seed and waiting for it to grow. Have your child fill a small disposable cup $\frac{3}{4}$ full of soil and make a small hole in the center of the dirt with her fingers. Place any flower seed (or a lima bean seed, which grows quickly) in the hole and cover it with soil. Add a small amount of water to the soil and place it in a sunny place in your home. Discuss the following questions:

- **How long do you think it'll take before we see the seed come up through the soil?** (For extra fun, jot down your child's guess on his cup and tally the number of days it takes for growth to be visible.)
- **What must happen for your seed to grow?**
- **As Jesus-followers, the Holy Spirit lives in us and helps us grow in faith. What are some things we can do that help us stay open to the Holy Spirit's work in us?**
- **Do growing seeds and growing in faith happen quickly? Why or why not?**



LIFE CONNECTION

Our Family Faith Story

Kids love hearing stories from those older than them—their parents, grandparents, and other significant adults in their lives!

Give your child two sheets of paper. Have him place the pieces together and fold them down the middle to make a book. Secure the book by stapling the binding together. Invite your child to decorate the front cover of the book using this title: Our Family Faith Story.

For each page of the book, prompt your child to think of one person in your family (mom, dad, grandparents, aunt, uncle, cousin, or a friend who's like family) to interview. Once decided, write that person's name on the top of a page. Your child can call, video chat, or even go visit each person they interview. Encourage him ask each person: **Can you tell me a story of when God was faithful to you?** After the interviews, your child can illustrate or transcribe each person's story into their books. Read the book together and thank God for His faithfulness and goodness to your family!
