FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- What are some things that make you feel afraid?
- What do you do when you're afraid?
- Because Jesus is the Son of God, He's more powerful than anything that scares us. How does this make you feel?
- How can you worship Jesus this week for being the Son of God?



HANDS ON

Power Feet

Jesus walked on the water to show the disciples He is the Son of God and has total authority and power over everything. Jesus did many miracles in the Bible, and He is worthy of all worship and praise for who He is. Determine who has the biggest foot in your family. Have that person put his or her foot on a large piece of paper, posterboard, or cardboard. Invite your child to trace around the person's foot. While your child is tracing, read the following verses:

Matthew 14:32–33

John 3:35

Colossians 1:15–18

Once the foot has been traced, let everyone color and decorate the foot shape. You could also write some of the key words from the verses you just read about Jesus being the Son of God. End your time together by thanking God for sending His Son into the world and for showing us what He is like.



LIFE CONNECTION

Jesus in My Week

Some people use calendars and schedules to keep track of activities and important dates. Pull out your calendar or another device that shows an upcoming schedule. This could be a school schedule with assignments, a sport's calendar with practices and games, or some other schedule with tasks that need done.

Ask each person in your family to choose something that's coming up they consider hard or something they might be anxious or fearful about. Examples might include an upcoming spelling test, a dental appointment, etc. Remind your family of the words Jesus spoke to His disciples in Matthew 14:27 (NIV): "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." Invite them to recall these words each time they face something hard this week. They don't need to be scared or worried because Jesus is with them through everything. He is the Son of God who is able to take their hand and help them through whatever is making them afraid.
