

Week 1 - September 13th – Called Out (1 Peter 1:1-2)

Warm-Up Question: *What's the best letter, card, or message you've ever gotten? Who was it from and why did it make you happy?*

Opening

We're starting a new book of the Bible together, 1 Peter. It's a letter written by one of King Jesus' closest friends, a guy named Peter. Right at the start, Peter tells his readers something important... they've been *called out*. That means God picked them out of their ordinary lives to be a part of something far bigger and greater, His family.

Before we dig into this letter, though, let's remember how Peter himself got called out to KNOW Jesus. Because before he was writing letters about Jesus' Kingdom, he was just a fisherman.

Read Luke 5:1-11

Peter was a professional fisherman. He knew boats, nets, and fish better than most people. Jesus? Not so much. Jesus was a carpenter's son, not a fisherman. But one day, Jesus told people to throw his nets into the water, even though Peter had already fished all night and caught nothing.

- **Question 1:** *Why do you think Peter listened to Jesus, even though fishing wasn't Jesus' job?*
- **Question 2:** *Have you ever tried really hard at something and it didn't work out, but then you tried it a different way (maybe somebody else's idea) and it worked? Tell that story!*
- **Question 3:** *Peter left his boat, his nets, and his job to follow King Jesus without knowing what would happen next. Is there anything in your life King Jesus might be asking you to set aside so you can KNOW Him more closely?*

Read Matthew 14:22-33

This is probably Peter's most famous moment of all time. In the middle of a storm, Peter saw Jesus walking on water and asked if he could try it too.

- **Question 4:** *Why do you think Peter wanted to get out of the boat and walk on water?*
- **Question 5:** *What do you think he learned by walking on water... and from sinking into the sea?*

Read Luke 22:54-60

This part of the story isn't Peter's proudest moment. While King Jesus was being wrongfully arrested, Peter got scared. Three different times, strangers asked if Peter knew Jesus. And three times, Peter lied and said no.

Take a minute in silence and think... *Has there ever been a time I acted like I didn't KNOW Jesus?* This doesn't always have to be something you said out loud. It could be a choice you made or something you did (or didn't) do. If you feel comfortable, share with your family (parents/guardians lead the way by sharing first). Then take a moment to tell God about it and ask Him for His help next time.

Jesus called Peter out of a normal life into an extraordinary one. Although Peter never became rich or famous by our world's standards, he got to spend three whole years walking, talking, and eating middle-eastern flatbread with the literal Savior of the world.

- **Question 6:** *In what ways does your everyday life look normal?*
- **Question 7:** *Has there ever been a moment where you saw the Holy Spirit working in you, through you, or around you?*

Family Prayer

Dear Jesus,

Thank you for calling us out of everyday life into something extraordinary with You. Give us the courage to step out in faith like Peter did even when life is hard or scary. Help us to leave behind anything that gets in

the way of following You closely. Show us what You want us to do and give us the courage to do it. Amen.

Week 2 - September 20th – Hope in a Dying World (1 Peter 1:3-12)

Warm-Up Question: *Has anyone ever given you something super special like a gift, an heirloom, or money set aside just for you? What made it so special?*

Opening

Everything in this world eventually wears out, breaks, or comes to an unexpected end. But the Bible says that because of King Jesus, we can have a hope that never runs out.

Here's something important to remember... Being saved isn't a one-time experience that happens and then you're done in your relationship with Jesus. It's also an ongoing journey! When we KNOW Jesus for the very first time (justification), God gives us the Holy Spirit to help us LIVE and LOVE like Jesus more and more throughout our entire lives (sanctification) until we see Him face to face in Heaven (glorification).

Peter knew this journey firsthand. Remember last week when Peter denied even knowing Jesus? After Jesus rose from the dead, He fully forgave Peter (in John 21) and gave him a job to do before Jesus traveled to Heaven.

Read Acts 1:4-5, 8-9

Before Peter could do anything big, Jesus told him and His other disciples to wait so that's exactly what they did. They waited and prayed.

Read Acts 2:1-13

- **Question 1:** *What happens when the Holy Spirit shows up in this story?*
- **Question 2:** *What do you imagine that moment felt like for Peter?*

Read Acts 2:14-41

Here's what's even crazier... this is the *same* Peter who (50 days earlier) was too scared to even admit that he knew Jesus. Now he stands up in front of a

HUGE crowd and gives a Spirit-led message about Jesus... and thousands of people hear it in their own language and believe!

- **Question 3:** *Where do you think Peter suddenly got the words and the courage to speak so boldly about King Jesus?*

The same Holy Spirit who turned scaredy-cat Peter into courageous Peter is available to every single person who knows Jesus regardless of their age. There is no such such thing as a Junior Varsity Holy Spirit for just children!

- **Question 4:** *Have you ever felt like the Holy Spirit was talking through you? What happened? How did you know it was Him?*
- **Question 5:** *Do you feel brave talking to others about Jesus? What makes that easy or hard for you?*

Read 1 Peter 1:3-12

According to this Bible passage, because of Jesus, we have a living hope that can NEVER get ruined, stolen, or rusted!

- **Question 6:** *Why do you think it matters that we let the Holy Spirit help us be courageous like Peter?*
- **Question 7:** *Look back at verse 12! Peter says the Good News was shared with power... whose power was it?*

Family Prayer Time

Take turns naming people you know who don't currently KNOW Jesus (neighbors, friends, classmates, teammates, family members, coworkers, etc.) Pray for them.

Holy Spirit,

Thank You for giving us the words and power to talk about Jesus. Help our faith to grow so we can be brave like Peter was. We pray for the people we love who don't know Jesus yet, especially (fill in the blank). Please soften

their hearts, minds, and souls and give us the right words to say at the right time to share the living hope we have. Amen.

Week 3 - September 27th – Set Apart, Not Checked Out (1 Peter 1:13 – 2:3)

Warm-Up Game: *Play a couple rounds of “Minute to Win It” games as a family! Examples [here](#)!*

Opening

Did time feel like it flew by during those games? A minute can go by so fast!

This week’s Bible passage in 1 Peter reminds us that our entire lives on Earth are kind of like that... shorter than we think. So, how do we use the time God gives us in a way that truly matters?

Let’s look at how Peter himself lived this out!

Read Acts, Chapter 3

Notice that Peter and John were heading to the temple at a specific time to pray. The very first Christ followers actually stopped what they were doing and prayed *three times a day* (morning, noon, and afternoon). They also skipped meals sometimes (this is called fasting) on certain days to remember King Jesus and focus more on God than food.

- **Question 1:** *Peter made time for prayer a regular part of his day. Do you have regular times when you pray?*

In this same chapter (Acts 3), Peter heals a man by the power of the Holy Spirit and then boldly tells the crowd about Jesus again!

- **Question 2:** *Talk about a time you told someone about Jesus or shared something you believe. How did it go? If you had the chance again tomorrow, would you feel ready to share?*

Family Activity: *Take turns! Give each person 3 minutes to share their own story... How did you first get to KNOW Jesus? How has He changed your life? What hope does He give you? Keeping it short helps people actually listen.*

- **Question 3:** *What stood out to you from the video?*

Read 1 Peter 1:13-2:3

- **Question 4:** *Look at 1 Peter 2:1! Peter lists things to get rid of, like meanness, jealousy, and lying. How can we actually do that? (Hint: look back at 1 Peter 1:22 for a clue!)*
- **Question 5:** *Peter talks about "nourishment" like spiritual food that helps us grow. He means things like reading the Bible, going to church, and spending time with other Christ followers. What are you doing to nourish your soul?*

Lord, help us LOVE like Jesus and help us be ready to share the hope You've given us. Help us know You so well personally that we can honestly talk about how You've changed our lives. Give us hearts that care about people who don't know You yet and help us truly live like sharing hope in Jesus matters. Make us more like You... loving and good so that through how we treat each other, others would want to know You too. Amen.

Family Challenge: *This week set an alarm to go off three times a day. Every time it rings, pause whatever you're doing and pray for at least one minute (even if it's just a "thank you God" or "help me Holy Spirit with..." Try also skipping one meal or snack this week and spend that meal time praying for somebody you know who doesn't yet know Jesus.*

Week 4 - October 4th – Built Together, Not Alone (1 Peter 2:4-10)

Warm-Up Question: *When's a time somebody showed up for you exactly when you needed them?*

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and become more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 2:4-10

Peter talks a lot about stones in this passage... Let's figure out why!

Read Matthew 16:13-20

In this story, Peter boldly proclaims that Jesus is the Christ (another word for the Messiah or God's promised Rescuer). Jesus responds by telling Peter that his name (which means "rock") fits because "on this rock I (Jesus) will build my Church."

Here's the big idea! King Jesus is the cornerstone, the most important stone that everything else is built on and lines up with. Peter was one of the Church's first leaders. And everybody who believes what Peter believed (that Jesus is the Christ), is like a living stone who gets built into that same Church.

Nobody is left out and everybody matters in Jesus' Church.

Read Acts 4:1-22

- **Question 1:** *Where did Peter get the power and courage to speak so boldly? (Look at verse 8 for the answer.)*

Look at what Peter says in verses 11-12. He connects Jesus back to a prophecy from the Old Testament, Psalm 118:22. Despite Jesus being the "rejected stone" by some, He turned out to be the most important stone all along. Verse 12 is a great verse to write down on a sticky note and put it somewhere you'll see often like your bathroom mirror!

- **Question 2:** *How does verse 13 make you feel? Encouraged, surprised, or something else?*
- **Question 3:** *Look at verse 20! Peter and John couldn't stop talking about what they've seen and heard. Have you experienced something so real and amazing with Jesus that you just had to tell somebody about it?*

Read Acts 4:23-30

Read this Bible passage slowly together out loud. It's an actual prayer early Christ followers prayed! Then read Acts 4:31 to see what happened afterward. Finish by praying your own version of verse 31... asking God for more of His Holy Spirit and courage to boldly share about King Jesus.

Read 1 Peter 2:9-10

- **Question 4:** *These verses describe Christ followers as a chosen people, a forever family, a group that's set apart for God. Why do you think it's important that we KNOW Jesus and follow Him together instead of alone?*

Read Acts 2:42-47 and Acts 4:32-37

- **Question 5:** *What stands out to you about how the early Church treated each other and shared what they had?*
- **Question 6:** *What might it look like for our own church, MCC, to have that same kind of closeness and care today?*

Family Prayer

Lord over everything, You made the sky, the Earth, the oceans, and all that's in them. Even when the world around us feels scary or hard, help us, Your people to speak about You boldly in a dying world. Use us to bring healing and to make things right, here on Earth, the way You want them to be. Amen.

Week 5 - October 11th – Winsome Witness (1 Peter 2:11-25)

Warm-Up Game: *Play a round or two of Chameleon together! [You can play it free here!](#)*

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

In Chameleon, one player doesn't know the secret word and has to blend in with everybody else so nobody notices. As Christ followers, our job is actually the complete opposite. We're not supposed to blend in with the world around us like a chameleon changing colors. We're called to stand out, in a good way, so that we can bring hope and life to the people around us.

Read 1 Peter 2:11-12

- **Question 1:** *Share about a time you went along with the crowd even though it wasn't the best choice OR a time that you were brave enough to do the right thing even though it was different from everyone else. What happened? How did people react?*

If our lives look exactly like everyone else's, there's nothing that makes people curious about Jesus. Living like Jesus means our lives sometimes look different and that's a good thing!

- **Question 2:** *Think back to what we read last week about the early Church in Acts 2 and 4 (Week 4). What are some things our church or your family could be known for that would make others curious about King Jesus?*

Read 1 Peter 2:13-25

- **Question 3:** *What's your honest reaction to the word "submission"? Does it bother you, confuse you, or make sense to you and why?*
- **Question 4:** *What does healthy respect for authority look like... for God and for the leaders in your life?*

Important Note: *This passage is not saying it's okay for anyone to be treated badly, enslaved, or abused... that's never okay and God cares deeply about justice for people who are mistreated. What this passage does offer is encouragement for tough moments when life feels unfair!*

- **Question 5:** *Think of a situation that makes you feel angry or frustrated because it feels unfair. How can you hand that anger over to God, trusting Him to make things right in the end?*

Read Acts 5:12-42

Peter and the other early Christ followers were treated unfairly and even punished for following King Jesus... and yet they kept going.

- **Question 6:** *What amazes you about Peter and the other apostles in this story?*
- **Question 7:** *Is there something that the Holy Spirit has been nudging you about lately... something you feel like you should do or change?*

Read John 21:15-17

Verse 25 feels random at first but it actually connects back to something huge in Peter's own story! Before Jesus' death on the cross, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times. However, after Jesus rose from the dead, He ate breakfast with Peter and made sure Peter knew he was fully forgiven.

Jesus also gave Peter a job... take care of God's people, like a shepherd takes care of a sheep! This moment and the Holy Spirit filling Peter in Acts 2, gave Peter the boldness and purpose to lead and care for the Church.

Take a moment to pray for the pastors and leaders at our church!

Peter knew what it was like to be a sheep who wandered off but he also came to know God as the Good Shepherd who brings us back. Let's pray Psalm 23 together as a family:

LORD, you are our Shepherd - we lack nothing. You lead us to safety, nourishment, and refreshing. You return us to You. You guide us along the

right paths for Your name's sake. Even when we walk through dark valleys we will fear no evil, for You are with us. Your discipline and correction comforts us. You prepare a table of abundance in the middle of the battlefield. You honor and refresh us, our cups overflow. Surely Your goodness and love will follow us all the days of our lives, and we will dwell in the house of the LORD forever!

- **Question 8:** *If we spend our lives really getting to KNOW Jesus... staying close to Him, aware He's with us, and trusting Him to take care of us, what would other people notice about us?*

Family Challenge:

Read one Psalm together each day this week. Read it slowly and try turning it into your own prayer to God. As you do, pay attention to the Holy Spirit's presence in you and ask Him for courage to talk about King Jesus boldly with others!

Week 6 - October 18th – Countercultural Marriages (1 Peter 3:1-7)

Warm-Up Question: Parents, share your engagement story in a minute or less! Kids, what do you think makes a marriage strong?

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 3:1-7

This could be a tricky passage! So, let's slow down to better understand it together.

Peter wrote this a long, long, long time ago in a culture very different than ours. Back then, husbands had a lot of authority in marriage and wives usually didn't. Wives were often expected to follow their husband's religion.

So, Peter is writing to women who have become Christ followers and might be wondering, "Should I leave my husband since he doesn't believe what I believe?"

Peter's answer wasn't "leave." Instead, he gave them a plan... live in such a loving and faithful way that your husband notices something different about you. Different enough to make him curious about Jesus too.

It's important to know, Peter isn't saying that men having more authority is God's perfect design for how marriage *should* work, in the same way that he wasn't saying slavery (which he mentioned back in chapter 2) was okay either. He's meeting people exactly where they were, in a hard and unfair culture, and showing them how to shine bright for King Jesus right where they were.

- **Question 1:** *How could God use our current relationships (family, friends, schoolmates, etc.) to draw others to Jesus?*

As Christ followers, we have two main jobs!

1. To KNOW Jesus
2. To help others KNOW Him too

Read Acts 7

As Stephen is being attacked for his faith in Jesus, he gives a powerful speech about God's Big Story. He cares more about KNOWing Jesus than he cares about saving his own life. Notice who's watching at the end of the chapter, a man named Saul, who would later become the Apostle Paul! Stephen's bravery likely planted a seed that helped lead Saul to Jesus later in Acts 9.

Back in 1 Peter 3:7, Peter calls wives "co-heirs", meaning equally valued and equally loved by God. In Peter's culture, where women often weren't valued much at all, this was a huge deal! Peter also says a husband's prayers can be hindered (blocked or hurt) if he doesn't treat his wife with honor and respect. That was a radical thing to say back then!

King Jesus also treated women with honor too. Women followed Him, learned from Him, and helped support His ministry. In the early church, we see women doing important things...

- Women were likely included when the Holy Spirit came upon everyone at Pentecost (Acts 2:17-18)
- A woman named Lydia probably led a church that met in her home (Acts 16:15, 40)
- A woman named Priscilla taught others about the Way of Jesus (Acts 18:26)
- Women shared messages from God (prophesied) (Acts 21:8-9)

Question 2: *Why do you think it matters that God uses both men and women to grow His kingdom?*

Every person, no matter who they are, has real value in God's kingdom. And the Holy Spirit can use any of us to tell others about Jesus!

- **Question 3:** *What does it look like to put others first and think of them as more important than yourself?*
- **Question 4:** *How might our world be different if we cared more about people's hearts than how they look on the outside and LOVED each other like Jesus?*

Family Prayer

Lord,

May how we treat each other point people to You. May our love stand out more than anything else about us. Help us lift others up instead of trying to be in charge over them. We pray for marriages in our church and community... make them strong, loving, and full of respect for one another. Holy Spirit, please work in the hearts of the people we love who don't know You yet, and help us show them who You are, both in what we say and what we do. Amen.

WEEK 7 - Oct. 25 – Passionate Peacemakers (1 Pt. 3:8-12)

Warm-up: Do you know anyone who is really peaceful? How can you tell?

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 3:8-12.

- **Question 1:** How should verses 8-9 impact how we treat one another as a family?
- **Question 2:** Look at v. 10. How can we do better at saying kind words and always being truthful?
- **Question 3:** Look at v. 11. How can we pursue peace as a family? What would make our home more peaceful?
- **Question 4:** Why does it matter how we live around those who do not know Jesus?

How we treat others matters. We are called to treat our family with love, respect, kindness, and peacefulness. We are to treat brothers and sisters in Christ with compassion and humility.

Let's look at how the gospel continues to spread in Acts.

Read Acts 8:1-7.

- **Question 5:** How are the people treated and what is their response?

Read Acts 8:26-40.

- **Question 6:** How important is it that Philip listened to the Holy Spirit (v.29)? How do you listen to the Spirit?

The Holy Spirit was drawing the Ethiopian's heart to Jesus, but he used Philip to help lead him to saving faith.

Verse 35 says that Philip told him the "good news" about Jesus (remember, this is the definition of "gospel"), and in v. 40, Philip continues to preach the

gospel wherever he goes.

- **Question 7:** What do you think is the good news about Jesus? Can you explain it?

Family Prayer: *Lord, help us to work toward peace in our family and with our friends. Help the words we say to be kind and true. Thank you, Jesus, that you hear our prayers. Amen.*

WEEK 8 - Nov. 1 – Ready for Action (1 Pt. 3:13-22)

Warm-up Game: Play 2 or 3 rounds of [Reverse Charades](#). Hint: select the category of “animals” or “emotions.” One person acts while the rest of the group has two minutes to guess as many of the words as they can.

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

In charades, you have to be ready for action. As soon as you see a word, you need to put movement to it so others can guess it. In today’s passage, Peter calls all believers to be ready for action.

Read 1 Peter 3:13-18.

1 Peter 3:15 is a great verse to memorize. Post it somewhere that you will see it often this week, like the kitchen counter or a door or window.

- **Question 1:** Hope doesn’t just mean you hope you get a new dog. Hope in Jesus is knowing for sure that he is working for our good and that one day we will spend forever with him without sickness, sadness, or pain. How hard is it for you to tell others about your hope in Jesus?

In the book of Acts, when someone believes in Jesus, their next step is to be baptized.

Read Acts 2:38-41, Acts 8:12, 36-38, Acts 10:47-48, and Acts 22:16.

- **Question 2:** If you’ve been baptized, share your baptism story in a minute or less. Why did you make that decision? What was special about that day?
If you haven’t been baptized since believing in Jesus, how will you know if you’re ready to take that step?
(Parents - visit mcc.church/beliefs and read our baptism statement and pray for wisdom on if God is calling you or your child to take that step.)
Baptism is also a great witness toward unbelievers. If you choose to get

baptized, who could you invite to come support you at your baptism who might not yet know Jesus?

Read Acts 9:1-22 about when Paul (Saul) first believed in Jesus.

- **Question 3:** How long did Saul wait after believing in Jesus to start telling others about him? You don't have to be a certain age to be a witness for Jesus. God wants each of us to tell as many people as we can about how great Jesus is!

Read Acts 9:23-31.

- **Question 4:** What do you notice about fear in these verses? Who or what should we fear?

Family Prayer: *Holy Spirit, prepare us for action! Prepare us to tell others how great you are. Help us not to be afraid, but to be courageous because we believe in Jesus and his Holy Spirit is with us.*

WEEK 9 - Nov. 8 – Living for What Lasts (1 Pt. 4:1-11)

Warm-up: Have you ever worked really hard toward a goal? Talk about it.

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LOVE more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 4:1-6.

- **Question 1:** How has KNOWing Jesus changed what is important to you?

Read 1 Peter 4:7-11.

- **Question 2:** Share about a time God helped you to bless others.

Let's continue reading in Acts, watching how God taught Peter to use his gifts to serve others in love.

Read Acts chapter 10.

- **Question 3:** What do you learn about the Holy Spirit in this chapter?

Family Prayer: *Jesus, we want to love you and help others so they can KNOW you too. Holy Spirit, help us to remember that you are always with us, living inside us so we can have peace, courage, and love. Help us to live how you want us to live, and change our hearts so we can love like you do.*

WEEK 10 - Nov. 15 – Suffering in Solidarity (1 Pt. 4:12-19)

Warm-up: Do you remember having a really bad day? Share about it.

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 4:12-19.

- **Question 1:** How easy is it to do what's right even if you'll get in trouble or made fun of?

No one wants to be treated badly, but there may come a time when others are mean to you because you believe in Jesus or do what is right. There are Christians all over the world who are suffering because they believe in Jesus.

- **Question 2:** Can you imagine if we had to have church secretly in someone's basement because we could get arrested if people knew we were singing praise songs or reading our Bibles? What would that be like?

We are so thankful that we can worship and pray to God in America, and even in public schools, we can tell others about Jesus. Do you know when most people believe in Jesus? Before they graduate high school. That means that students and kids have the best opportunity to tell others about Jesus. When you tell others what you learn about God, how you can feel his love and peace, and the great hope that you have knowing you'll live forever with him, you can help God with his work.

God's goal is for everyone to believe in him and he wants us to help him! He's given the Holy Spirit to give us courage and words to say, but we need to be willing to try.

- **Question 3:** Who could you invite to church this week? Who could you talk to about how much you love Jesus?

Read Acts 11:19-24.

- **Question 4:** Who do we want to see brought to KNOW Jesus? Let's pray for them every day this week!

Family Prayer: *Jesus, we pray for _____ (name people you know that don't believe in Jesus). Holy Spirit, help them to believe in Jesus and help us to talk about him often around them, no matter what they think or how they might treat us. Help us to be so loving, joyful, and kind that people can see we LOVE like Jesus!*

WEEK 11 - Nov. 22 – Rooted, Not Shaken (1 Pt. 5:1-14)

Warm-up: Think back to the beginning of the school year and the 1 Peter study. Everyone take turns sharing at least 3 things that have happened during this time (or that you've learned) that you are thankful for.

Opening Prayer: *Holy Spirit, please speak to us and teach us today. Help us listen closely and LIVE more like Jesus.*

Read 1 Peter 5:5-14.

- **Question 1:** What are you worried about? What would it look like to throw those worries on Jesus?
- **Question 2:** What do you know about the devil? Have you ever felt him try to trick you into doing something you shouldn't or believing something that isn't true?

We don't need to be afraid of the devil, but we do need to be aware of him. We need to know he tries to trick us, but God is stronger than he is and we can win every time if we allow the Holy Spirit inside us to lead, guide, and give us courage, strength and wisdom.

- **Question 3:** As we reach the end of 1 Peter, reflect over this study. What is the biggest thing God has taught you or the greatest way he has shaped your heart and life? What are you going to do to keep growing now that we're done?
Spend some time in prayer, thanking and praising God for the work he has done throughout this study.

Read Acts 12:1-19.
