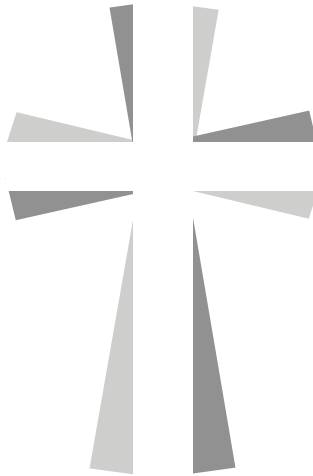

Children at Trinity


