The Journey of the Text

UNIT Challenge: We will be memorizing the Books of the Bible! Because God's word is His Love letter to us and our Battle plan in this life, this Unit will help us better understand the origin, authorship, accuracy, and enduring power of this book we call the Bible! May you grow leaps and bounds in your knowledge of God's power and intention for you throughout this study.

Many have wanted an explanation for the origin of the scriptures. The deep search and study of how this collection of writings came together have led many to invest their whole lives and all of their resources in search of the answer. Have you ever wanted to know something so much you were willing to give all your time and savings to figure out the answer? [Read 1 Peter 1:10-13]

Peter mentions these men made careful searches. In other words, they were searching for a treasure, and they didn't want to miss a single detail. The question is: **WHERE** did they search? and **WHAT** did they find? In order to completely understand this study and the process by which these men searched we need to establish a known ground rule. Our first ground rule is: _____ came from an eyewitness, was passed down from generation to generation, and then the stories were written down and recorded.



An eyewitness bears the greatest authority in any legal situation. In our modern legal system, an eyewitness can determine a criminal's fate by testifying to what they saw with their own eyes. Then, the Jury takes that testimony and determines the actions of correction. Life and death are determined by the tongue of the Eyewitness. In terms of the Bible, we see the book of Genesis being spoken from the eyewitness account of Adam and Eve to their children, then to their children, all the way down to Moses and Aaron at the time of the Exodus. At that point, Moses wrote down Genesis through Deuteronomy and we have this writing preserved for us today in the Bible. Did you know the Bible's first **FIVE** books are called the **TORAH**?

You experience the power of Oral history whenever you sit with your grandmother or grandfather and listen to a story from their childhood. These stories will eventually be shared with your children and many others, and some of you may even write down these stories into a book for more people to enjoy and learn from for years to come.

Much of the Old Testament and some of the New Testament were shared through **Oral History** before they were written down. Once these stories of how God interacted with His people were recorded, they became Irreplaceable! Their value was so great, and they were prized so **HIGHLY** that only very specific people were allowed to take care of them. These people were known as scribes.

Scribes dedicated their lives to copying ancient texts. They were required to keep the strictest level of _____ and _____. By the light of a candle, with a feather pen, and without eyeglasses, these scribes worked word-perfect page after page in order to not lose any part of the story. 900 years after Yeshua lived, there was a group of scribes known as the _____. They preserved much of the Old Testament, specifically the book of Isaiah. The Masoretic text was the oldest ancient text we had until 1946.

In 1946, a young boy was tending to his sheep in the Judean wilderness just north of the Dead Sea. He looked up and saw a cave in the rock walls and decided to throw a stone into the cave. When the stone landed, he heard the sound of a clay pot breaking. This young boy, around 12 years old, had just found one of the most precious treasures of ALL time. He found what we call the Dead Sea Scrolls.

The Dead Sea Scrolls are the most complete and extensive Bible discovery of the last 2000 years! What is more exciting is that the Masoretic Text from 900 AD matched word for word the Dead Sea Scroll copy of the Book of Isaiah with _____% accuracy! However, the Book of Isaiah was not the only book found in the cave; more than _____ ancient books and writing fragments were found in the caves. Scholars have used this discovery to prove the integrity of this Powerful and God-given book called the Bible!

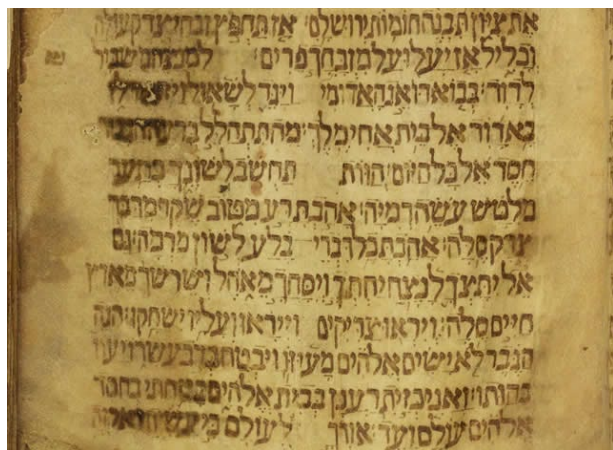

Eyewitnesses provide the Testimony

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Last week, we learned how the Oral history of the World was communicated down the generations. These stories were then written down and recorded with the utmost accuracy so the generations after would know this priceless Truth. The Dead Sea Scrolls, discovered in 1946, have provided us with thousands of ancient documents that prove the consistency and accuracy of this Truth. **2 Timothy 3:16**, "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for **teaching**, for **reproof**, for **correction**, for **training** in righteousness."

Today, we will talk about how important eyewitnesses are to the collection of Scripture. Did you know that all four of the Gospels were written by people who received eyewitness testimonies of Yeshua's ministry? This means people who walked and talked with Yeshua shared their stories with someone who then wrote them down.



In the 4th century, a group of religious men were compelled by the Holy Spirit to compile eyewitness accounts of Yeshua into one collection of books. These leaders created what we call the "Canon" of scripture. Canon is a Greek word meaning "measuring stick." Whenever we do anything significant, we need to know the expectation of quality. In other words, if you are going to produce something of quality, you need to measure your work against specific

standards of excellence. For the 4th century leaders, the most important and preeminent requirement of this collection was each writing had to be an eyewitness account taken from credible sources that did not contradict each other.

The work of these 4th Century leaders brought us the New Testament! The Jewish leadership already had their "**MEASURING STICK**" or Canon created from the writings of Moses to the last Prophet, Malachi, and the Old Testament writings were unanimously accepted by the 4th-century counsel, completing what we know today as the Bible.

_____:10-12, "As to this salvation, the prophets who prophesied of the grace that *would come* to you made _____ and inquiries, seeking to know what person or time the Spirit of Christ within them was indicating as He predicted the sufferings of Christ and the glories to follow. It was revealed to them that they were not _____ themselves, but you, in these things which now have been announced to you through those who preached the gospel to you by the _____ sent from heaven—things into which angels long to look."

Careful searches were made by righteous men who held the highest of standards for our benefit. If there was an account that did not agree with other eyewitness accounts, it was deemed as unreliable and untrustworthy. If there were teachings that arose and began to be shared in the 1st and 2nd centuries, they were quickly silenced and deemed unreliable because they contradicted the eyewitness accounts of Yeshua. By following this important system of credibility, the Word of God has been preserved in its purest form to this day.

Here is a list of the dates and authorship of the Gospels:

1. _____ The Gospel of Mark was written by Mark. However, the account and events of what happened were the eyewitness accounts of Peter, the Apostle of Yeshua.
2. _____ Matthew wrote the gospel of Matthew. Matthew was a disciple of Yeshua. Do you remember when Yeshua called Matthew to be His disciple?
3. _____ Luke wrote the account of the ministry of Yeshua based upon Eyewitness accounts and previously written documentation. Luke was Apostle Paul's personal doctor.
4. _____ The gospel of John was written by the Apostle John. John was the disciple who was very near and close, like best friends, with Yeshua.

Are you beginning to see the importance of eyewitness accounts? Children in the first century were not distracted by video games or television. They listened to stories from their parents and families. These stories were of great significance and were held tightly so they could be shared with children and families to come.

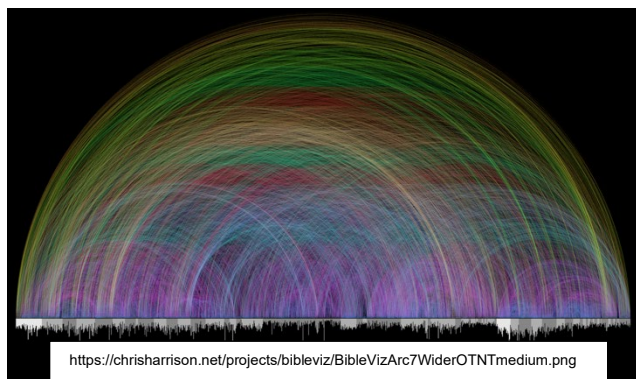

The Word is the SUM of Truth

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The word SUM is a Latin word originating from Summus, meaning: "the total amount resulting from the addition of two or more numbers, amounts, or items," -definition taken from the Oxford Dictionary. We find a sum by taking ALL the known numbers and adding them together to get the TOTAL number. Example: Mom gave five apples, dad gave three apples, brother gave two apples. How many apples altogether? _____ In terms of information, we calculate the **TOTALITY** of information based on the many details that make up the whole story.

Did you know that the Bible cross-references itself 63,779 times? This means that many authors who lived over 1,000 years apart wrote about the same events. From Genesis to Revelation, there are connections with very detailed descriptions, giving us a clear picture of the Heart of God. Remember, the Bible is a love letter that has come from God. The words we read, the stories, the victories and the defeats show us about ourselves and the faithful God who has called us to know Him. Let's take a look at some of these cross references.



The prophet Isaiah wrote the book of Isaiah around 740-700 BC. 700 hundred years before the coming of Messiah. Check out this verse.

_____:2, "Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The Lord, the Lord himself, is my _____ and my _____; he has become my salvation."

Take note of the words strength, defense, and salvation. Isaiah is speaking from the utterance of the Spirit of God and from his personal hope in Yahweh. Now, take a look at what Moses wrote.

_____:2, "The Lord is my _____ and song, and He has become my _____; This is my God, and I will praise Him; My father's God, and I will extol Him."

Notice the same words, and not only the same words but the same thread of knowledge being communicated through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and through Moses' hope in the Lord. What you just witnessed is called a cross-reference and the Bible is **FULL** of them. This is important to note because we see many authors who were not connected to each other giving details about the same story. The story is of the character and nature of our God. Here is another verse written by David.

_____:1, "The Lord is my light and my _____ whom shall I fear? The Lord is the _____ of my life of whom shall I be afraid?"

Again, do you see the thread of reference? David is proclaiming the same story of God's character and his personal hope in Yahweh! Three men shared the same story about the character of God, although they never had coffee or shared notes and lived hundreds of years apart is pretty amazing, wouldn't you say? I would have a hard time believing the testimony of one man but not three. Check this out.

The resurrection of the Messiah is one of the most documented events in all of history, and for good reason. A man was crucified, committed to the grave, and then rose ALIVE to walk again. [Read 1 Corinthians 15:3-8]

Verse 6 states that Yeshua appeared to more than five hundred men at one time! Meaning after the resurrection 500 brethren saw that Yeshua, who was dead was ALIVE. This is a highly believable testimony one that many, religious and non-religious authors write about. The resurrection had at one event 500 eyewitnesses, while the entirety of scripture has 63,779 cross-referencing testimonies. The sum of God's word equals itself and we see this through the beautiful consistency from the Old Testament to the New! This is another reason why we can trust the word of GOD!

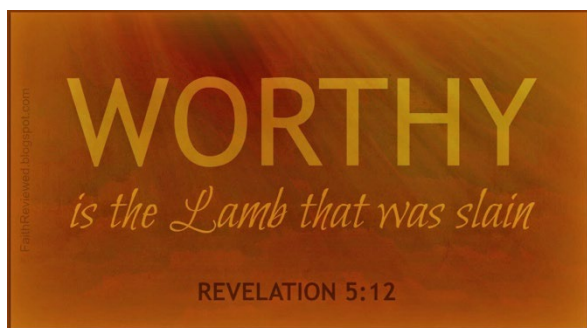

A Consistent Message

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Last week, we looked at the fantastic number of cross-references found in God's word, 63,779, to be exact! This number of references comes from many men writing about the same God at many different times throughout history. Through the Totality of information received from the writers, we can see the character of Yahweh and His plan determined from the very beginning. Today, we will look at the timeline of events recorded in scriptures from Genesis to Revelation to see the clear and continual story God has written for us.

_____:8, "All who dwell on the earth will _____ him, whose _____ have not been written in the Book of _____ of the _____ slain from the foundation of the world."



This verse teaches us an interesting truth about Yeshua and His plan. First, John, the disciple who leaned upon Yeshua, wrote this letter in his latter years, and it is the last letter to be added to the Bible as we know it. Yeshua commanded John at the beginning of Revelation to record all that he saw and witnessed. In verse 8, he records the "**Lamb** was **slain** from the foundation of the

world." The work of God's redemption through the lamb of God who was slain is the theme of the GOOD News throughout the entire Bible. Below, you will find a list of Gospel passages written by different men at different times, yet all pointing us to the picture of Yeshua being slain from the beginning. Can you see how the Bible has been written by the Holy Spirit through God fearing men? Can you see how the Lord has preserved and assured us of the integrity of the Bible through the finding of the Dead Sea Scrolls and the scribes who gave their lives to ensure contextual accuracy? Can you see that the Bible was written by eyewitnesses, not some storywriter looking for a good story? Now we can also see how the Bible was written by **different** authors at **different** times, and the same story was written from many different perspectives. This should only strengthen the reliability of God's word to the world.

After the baptism of Yeshua, John the Baptist testified, John 1:29, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." John's testimony of Yeshua adds to the Biblical narrative of the Power and Love of our Salvation. The fact is the Bible is consistent, congruent, and an accurate Love letter preserved by the Hand of God through many years and by many people so that you will know the Height, the Depth, the Breadth, and the Width of God's love for you! From the fall of Adam and Eve to the return of the King in Revelation, we read about Yeshua's faithfulness and His redemptive work toward us. Like an instructional manual for a **HUGE** Lego set, the Bible makes known to us the way of relationship with our Creator and King. Do you know Him today?

_____:2-3, "like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the _____, so that by it you may _____ in respect to _____, if you have tasted the _____ of the Lord."

The Apostle Peter writes to us that we would LONG for the word of God! This very word you are holding in your hand, this very word that has come from the mouth of our Lord. Think about all the times Peter was calmed by the words of Yeshua. There was the time when he walked on water, cut the ear off of the priest's guard, and then Yeshua appeared before the disciples while they were fishing before He ascended. Peter was personally encouraged and inspired by the word countless times. As long as you continue to read and live by God's word, you will also be encouraged.

Who wrote the Bible? This question has been asked by many, many people. Oftentimes, people run into what seems to be a “faith roadblock” as they try to understand how imperfect men could write a book inspired by a Perfect God. With imperfect men writing the Bible, is the Bible credible? Can we trust men to communicate the Truths of a Perfect and Holy God? Let's dive into the Journey of Understanding the Bible.

2 Peter 1:20-21, “But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, **but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.**”

Over and over and time and time again, we see how a perfect God uses imperfect people to accomplish GREAT things. Below, you will find the writers of the Books of the Bible and some interesting facts about them. For some books, the human authors are quite clear, while others are less clear. Ultimately, God receives the glory for His word being communicated from Generation to Generation and studied by you and me!

Old Testament Writers

Writer Book(s) Interesting facts

_____	Exodus _____ Deuteronomy	Moses was spared from murder as a baby and then raised by Pharaoh's daughter. Moses was God's leader who led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. God revealed the beginning of time through Creation. He recorded the beginning of the Family of Israel from the call of Abraham, the life stories of Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. He was the writer of Torah.
Joshua	_____	He was a descendant of Joseph and was a personal attendant to Moses during the 40 years of wandering in the wilderness. After Moses died, he led the children of Israel into the Promised Land. He was a great captain and led God's people in many battles as they conquered the Land. He was their leader for 25 years.
Samuel	I Samuel	He may have helped write I Samuel. His mother brought him as a young boy to serve in the Temple and to be trained by the priest, Eli. Samuel anointed the Kings of Israel. After the death of Eli, Samuel became the last judge of Israel and began the Prophet age.
Ezra	_____	He was a descendent of Aaron, the high priest. He also became a priest and scribe. When the people of Israel were captives in Babylon, he was chosen to take the first group of people back to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple. He had the honor of reading the scroll when the walls of Jerusalem were dedicated to the Lord.
_____	Nehemiah	He was a Jewish captive and the cup bearer for King Artaxerxes of Persia. He was given permission to return to Jerusalem to direct the rebuilding of the walls.

_____	Psalms (many of them)	David wrote most of the book of Psalms in Hebrew poetry. He is remembered as the shepherd boy who killed Goliath. He was also a soldier. He made Jerusalem Israel's capital city. He was chosen to be the king of Israel after King Saul. Through King David comes our Messiah, Yeshua.
_____	Some _____, Ecclesiastes _____	King David's son, he was the most powerful king of his day. He asked God for wisdom, and he was not only given wisdom but great wealth. He was not only a politician, but also a scientist and a business man. During his time as king, the great Temple was built. He is given credit for 3000 proverbs and words of wisdom.
Isaiah	Isaiah	He was a prophet of Judah. His book is called the Messianic Prophecy because he foretells the coming of Messiah, Yeshua. When the Dead Sea Scrolls were found, they found this scroll in its entirety.
Jeremiah	Jeremiah _____	He was from a priestly family. He began prophesying when he was a young man. A wicked king tried to kill him. While Daniel was warning the people in Babylon, Jeremiah stayed in Jerusalem to warn them.
	Ezekiel	He preached to the captives in Babylon, telling them of their return to Jerusalem. He was a powerful teacher for 22 years.
Daniel	Daniel	Daniel was born into a noble family. When he was taken captive, he became the servant of the king. Because God helped him to interpret dreams, he was made a ruler of the land. God gave to him some very exact prophecies, and some of them are still being fulfilled today. Daniel died in Babylon an old man, never to return to Jerusalem.
Hosea	Hosea	He wrote this minor prophecy (minor means short). He wrote about God's love to a people who had forgotten God and became worshipers of idols and pagan gods.
Joel		He wrote prophecies about the Holy Spirit and future blessing on Israel.
	Amos	He was a keeper of sycamore trees. He was also a shepherd, coming from a city south of Jerusalem. He warned about the judgment of idolatry.
Obadiah	Obadiah	Obadiah and Amos were friends. Obadiah wrote his prophecy to the Edomites, the descendants of Esau, who hated the Jews.
	Jonah	This book is the story of Jonah's life. God told him to go to Ninevah with a message of repentance, he was swallowed by a big fish, and finally was obedient to God. We read this account during Yom Kippur to demonstrate the importance of repentance. Jonah gives us a mirror picture of the 3 days in the belly of a fish and the 3 days Yeshua was in the grave.

Micah		Micah was a simple farmer and evangelist. While Isaiah was prophesying as a court poet, Micah was speaking to the common people. God gave him the prophecy of the messiah being born in Bethlehem.
Nahum		"Capernaum" means "City of Nahum." He may have been this city's founder. Yeshua visited this city often during his ministry. God gave Nahum a message for Ninevah, just like Jonah. Only this time it was a message of destruction.
Habakkuk	Habakkuk	Very little is known about Habakkuk. This book presents God as a Holy God.
Haggai	Haggai	He was one of the 3 prophets who wrote after the captivity in Babylon, when they came back to rebuild Jerusalem.
	Zechariah	He prophesied after the captivity in Babylon and foretold of the coming of Yeshua and His kingdom.
Malachi	Malachi	Prophesied after the captivity in Babylon, wrote about the coming messiah, John the Baptist, and the second coming of Yeshua.

The writers are uncertain for: Judges, Ruth, II Samuel, I and II Kings, I and II Chronicles, Esther, and Job; yet these books have been accepted by Jewish scholars for thousands of years.

New Testament Writers

There were 400 years between the Old Testament and the New Testament. The New Testament begins with the record of Yeshua's life, told by 4 of his followers: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. These are called the Gospels or "Good News."

Writer Book(s) Interesting Facts

Matthew	Matthew	He wrote the gospel of Matthew. He was also called Levi the Publican. He was a tax collector and was disliked by the people. Yeshua called him to be one of His 12 apostles.
	Mark	He was also known as John Mark. Paul took him on his first missionary journey. He wrote the shortest gospel and he was not an apostle. Mark wrote the Apostle Peter's account of Yeshua's life.
	Luke	Luke was a doctor and was called "beloved physician." He recorded more healings than the other gospels and he was not one of the 12 apostles.
John	II John III John	John and his brother, James, were fishermen when Yeshua called them to be apostles. He was called the "Beloved Disciple." When he was an old man he was exiled to the island of Patmos where God gave him the prophecies of Revelation.

	I Corinthians II Corinthians Ephesians Philippians I Thessalonians II Thessalonians II Timothy Titus Hebrews ?	Paul was once known as Saul of Tarsus who hated and persecuted Christians. After Yeshua appeared to him on the road to Damascus, He called him to be an apostle to the gentiles. He became the first great missionary taking 3 journeys to Asia and finally to Rome where he was martyred. The author of Hebrews is a widely debated and discussed question. Hebrew is widely considered to be written by Paul, but some scholars disagree.
Peter	 	Peter and his brother, Andrew, were fishermen when Yeshua called them to be apostles. He is remembered for his great faith, by walking on the water, and his human weakness when he denied Yeshua 3 times. He preached a great sermon at Pentecost (Shavuot) and he traveled and witnessed until he was martyred.
	James	He was the half-brother of Yeshua and he was called James the Just because of his goodness. He was Overseer of the Jerusalem church. History says he was pushed from a high place and was stoned and beaten to death.
Jude	Jude	He was the half-brother of Yeshua. He wrote to warn people of the dangers of false teachers in the church.

Learning about the authorship of scripture gives us a look into what kind of men these writers were. Through the Bible, we can see how the Holy Spirit inspired each of them. God chose men with personalities just like yours and your friends to prepare the work of His word for each generation to read and know. Understanding how the Holy Spirit spoke through each of these men should inspire you to listen more intently for the voice of the Lord. He has a lot to share with you, so listen closely!

Weekly Challenge: Take time to look up when these men lived. Create a timeline and plot each author in their proper time. When you are done, step back and take a look at how our God orchestrated His plan through Faithful men!

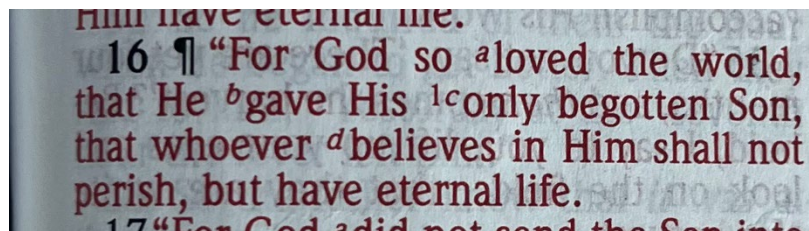

The message that changes US

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Is your understanding and love of God's word growing as you learn just how amazing and intentional He has been in writing this love letter for us? Receiving a letter in the mail is **EXCITING!** You walk out to the mailbox, open the door, reach in, and pull the mail out; immediately, you start reading the addresses, seeing if there is anything in there for you from a loved one or friend. What do you do when you find that you have received a letter? Do you put it on a shelf for a rainy day? Do you stuff it in a box and forget about it? **NO!** You open it up and cherish every word written. Right?

Yeshua's letter of love has been written to every single person, declaring both a universal and personal expression of God's ultimate **Love** and **plan** for His creation. This letter contains instructions for living, finding love, having happy friendships, and resolving conflicts between friends and enemies alike. Yet, many people place this love letter in a box or on a shelf, far away from their grasp. The value and power of God's words are discarded and rejected. Could you imagine treating a friend's letter to you in such a way?



The apostle Paul could not believe that his own people would disregard God's letters. He wrote to the believers in Romans from chapters 9 to 11

about God's plan for both the people of God who believe and those who do not believe.

_____:1-2, "Brethren, my heart's desire and my prayer to God for them is for *their* _____. For I testify about them that they have a _____ for God, but not in _____ with _____."

Paul desires for his people to obtain salvation. Even though they have zeal (passion and hunger), they do not have the proper **KNOWLEDGE** of God. Paul identifies that a person cannot be saved without a true knowledge of Salvation. Here's an example: James 2:19 says, "You do well to believe; the demons also believe, and they shudder." Demons believe in God and know His power more than we do. They absolutely believe, but they are not

filled with the right knowledge of God. In fact, they **FIGHT** against Him! Belief alone does not save a person. You need to believe in the right knowledge as well. Paul continues with

_____:8b-10, "the _____ of faith which we are preaching, that if you _____ with your mouth Jesus *as* Lord, and _____ in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be _____; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in _____, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in _____."

Notice how Paul says, "the **WORD** of **FAITH**," which is the knowledge of Yeshua's life, death, and resurrection, preached to the listeners. This word that Paul preached, if accepted, would lead to confession from a person's mouth proclaiming that Yeshua is the **LORD** and **SALVATION**, establish belief in their hearts, and ultimately lead to salvation.

The problem Paul faced was although many prophets and preachers were sent to the people, the people would not listen to the message. In fact, most of the people rejected the message.

_____:16, "However, they did not all _____ the good _____; for Isaiah says, "_____, who has _____ our _____?"

The passage cited from Isaiah comes from chapter 53:1, which is one of the OT chapters that shows how the Messiah would suffer for us. Who has considered the love God has prepared for all through the kindness of Messiah? All of us are in a place where we have the opportunity to hear and believe this message. But do we? Are we the kind of people who take God's love letter, put it on a shelf, and forget about it? Are we the kind of people who place His words in a box, neglecting the Love and direction He gives?

_____:17, "So _____ comes from _____, and hearing by the _____ of Christ."

Daily, be diligent to read this love letter that has been so intentionally preserved and prepared for us by a loving and faithful, God. Hide these words within your heart and believe the instructions through your actions.

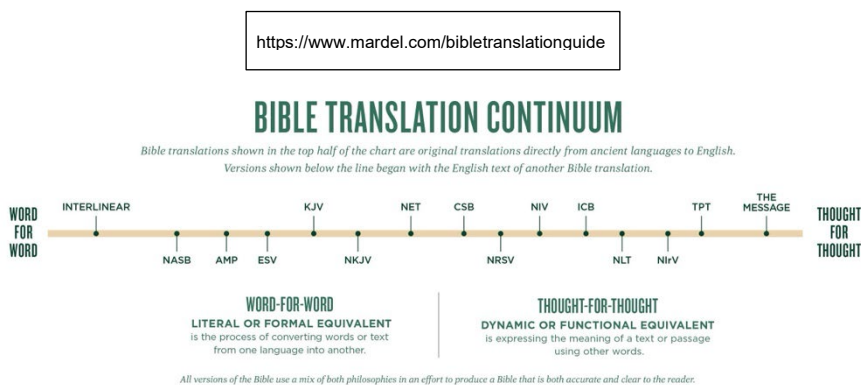
Can I trust my Translation?

UNIT Challenge: We will be memorizing the Books of the Bible! Because God's word is His Love letter to us and our Battle plan in this life, this Unit will help us better understand the origin, authorship, accuracy, and enduring power of this book we call the Bible!

We've studied how the ancient texts were copied and preserved with the greatest of care, but what about the different translations we have around us today? How do we know if the Bible we are reading is true and accurate to the original language? This week, we are going to look into the history of translation from the original text into the language used today.

Before Starting: Translating the Word is a serious task and translators are warned before they even start the translation process by God the Father Himself.

[CFM suggests a NASB or NKJV for the most accurate Word for Word translation.]

Yahweh wrote this strong warning to anyone who thinks altering and adding to His word is a good idea. His word is just that—His! Translators

are called to have the highest value for the Word and to protect the intended meaning and accuracy of the original manuscripts. It is incredible that God would have warned everyone to think twice about changing His Word. Check out this warning found in the Torah.

_____:20, "But the _____ who speaks a word _____ in My name which I have not _____ him to speak, or which he speaks in the name of other _____, that prophet shall _____."

God's word is **HIS**, and He gave His word to us as stewards of it. Anyone who takes away from the intent and content of His word is looking at serious consequences. Why is God's desire to protect His word for our sake so important?

What They Used: Bible translators used several ancient texts to translate into our modern tongue. For the OT, the Masoretic text written in Hebrew is used. For the NT, there are three main texts used: *ALEXANDRIAN*, *BYZANTINE*, and *WESTERN* Texts. Interestingly, the NT was written during a time when Aramaic, Greek, and Latin languages were used. Hence, the three different texts.

How did they do it? Once translators have these documents in front of them, they begin to break down the original languages, looking for the content and intent of the Scriptures. The translators go verse by verse, writing their first draft into the new language. Next, they utilize a Hebrew and Greek scholar to check the **ACCURACY** and **CLARITY**. Then, they share the translation with a community that determines the readability, practical communication for application, and critical accuracy for the reader. Before publishing, there is one more expert who looks over the work, and then it's off to the press for the Word of God to go into the nation and be shared with **ALL**!

Before our King's return, He wants everyone to know who He is, what He has done, and the Great Love He has for His creation. Translating His words into the languages of this world is an important work. This is one more way in which Yeshua is bringing this world back to Himself. Cherish your Bible, for it is the Word of God written for YOU! Read His word daily and Trust in His word every day of your life. Know You are **LOVED** by Your Heavenly Father!

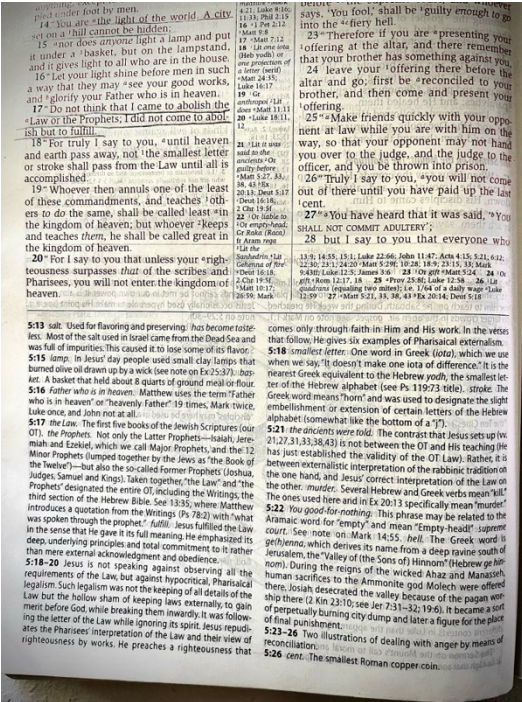

One of the major problems we face when we follow after the wrong voice speaking the wrong word is becoming as blind as that person. Did you know that much of Judaism in Israel is built around the wisdom of men/Rabbi's and not in the truth that **Yeshua** is **Messiah**? In fact, much of Judaism acknowledges that Yeshua was on earth, but was merely a man who blasphemed the Name of God.

In Matthew 15, Yeshua was standing before these men in person and became very frustrated because, through their unbelief, many of His people would be blinded in unbelief and not experience salvation. In addition to what Yeshua experienced that day, the Rabbi have written thousands of pages of thought and personal insight based upon the Scriptures, the writings of other Rabbi, and team writings in the works of the Talmud and Mishna. The Talmud is man's commentary of the Scripture, and the Mishna defines practices for keeping God's commandments (Much like the Corban mentioned above). J

1:1, "Let not _____ of you become _____, my brethren, _____ that as such we will incur a _____."

When you speak of the Lord and His truth, each of us has the BIG responsibility of communicating the Wisdom GOD has given us through His word, and NOT through the wisdom of MAN. It is through the wisdom of God that men are saved, not the other way around. God will hold a teacher to a higher standard because many will be impacted by the words and messages of teachers. As sons and daughters of God the Father, we all



have a responsibility to live our lives according to His word accurately. When we do this, the **WHOLE** world will see who He is through our love for one another.

The Jewish people have the ancient Talmud and the Mishna. Do New Testament Christians, like us, have something similar? Many Bibles come with what are called "footnotes." A footnote is designed to clarify a phrase and help the reader understand the Biblical text more clearly. This can be a super helpful thing, like asking your mentor to explain what a scripture means. But it can also be as damaging and confusing as the Pharisees were to the people of Israel when they led the people astray.

[Take a look at this picture. Can you see where the Scripture is and where the Footnotes are? Remember these words can be edifying and helpful in understanding the Truth of God, but they can also be distracting and simply WRONG.]

Remember, Footnotes are NOT scripture. Scripture is Scripture. And Only Scripture has the **AUTHORITY** to Teach, Correct, and Train in Righteousness (2 Tim 3:16). Always be alert and test **EVERYTHING** using the Word of God. His word is a lamp unto your feet and a light unto your path, and it is through His word you will be BLESSED!
