As men, we carry many responsibilities. After a long week of work, it's hard to muster the energy for house projects—especially when your family is longing for your time. With just 4 hours of your help, a brother gets an entire project off his plate—and time back with his family. Then, when it's your turn, the group comes to your place. Everyone contributes. Everyone receives. **This is what community looks like.**

## THE PLAN

Gather 3–4 guys to give just four hours on a Sunday to help a brother tackle a house project. The result? The power of multiplied labor: 3–4 men x 4 hours = 12–16 man-hours of work! And best of all, we're done by midday, giving you the rest of your Sunday to enjoy with your family.

## THE PROJECTS

Men's Serve is designed for short blitzes that will take those pesky annoyances off your plate, such as raking, painting, cutting wood, packing and organizing, cleaning, etc. (It is not for major projects.)

## SUNDAY WORKDAY SCHEDULE

- 7:45 AM -- Arrive, greet one another, and open in prayer
- 8:00–11:45 AM -- Work together (and have fun doing it!)
- 11:45–Noon -- Clean up.
- 12:00 PM -- Enjoy a host-provided lunch.
- Leave when the host kicks you out!

*Start time can be adjusted slightly, but aim to begin around 8 AM and wrap up around noon.*

## AN EXTRA BLESSING

When neighbors see a team of believers joyfully working together, it speaks volumes. It creates opportunities for witnessing—a TeenServe-style effect that opens doors for the Gospel.

## THINGS TO KNOW

- **Helpers:** Know your limits. Bring tools if needed and show up with a heart to serve.
- **Hosts:** Have all materials ready to complete the job and provide lunch after the work is done. Also consider signing up to serve elsewhere at least once during the summer.
- The culture of community is not simply lived out in a once-a-month Sunday workday. It is supposed to be a perpetual lifestyle. Keep your eyes open for ways to minister and be a brother to someone.

## MEN'S SERVE IS NOT...

- Not a moving service
- Not a carpentry company
- Not a helpline or honey-do service. (If there are greater service/carpentry needs in the body, qualified men and women will be informed and introduced to the situation, but Men's Serve should stay as Men's Serve for the purpose of building stronger families and fellowship within the body.)
