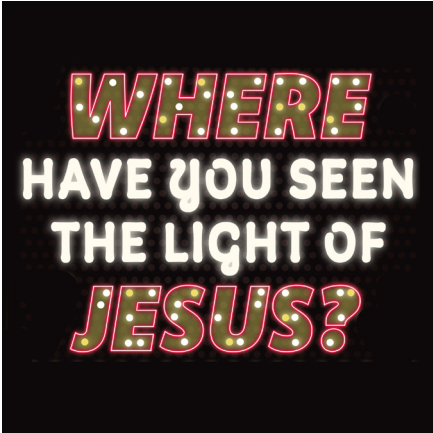

Day 2

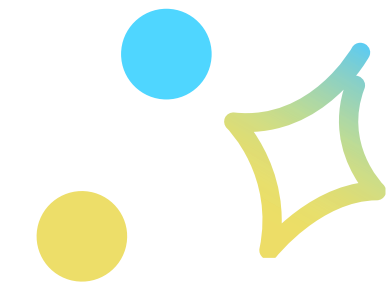
Read John 8:12

Read John 8:12 out loud, and as you do, come up with motions and actions you can do to illustrate the verse (such as turning on and off lights).

Before Jesus was born, many of the Israelites expected Him to arrive as a king. But Jesus arrived as a helpless baby and went on to be a humble carpenter. As he got older, he began to teach and perform miracles—shining God’s light in a different way than they expected, but shining nonetheless.

Jesus’ words that John recorded in John 8:12 angered the religious leaders, who expected the Savior of the world to follow the same rules and traditions that they did. But Jesus was telling the religious leaders—and everyone else—that He is indeed God’s Rescuer, sent to bring light to a dark world.

Once more, act out the words in John 8:12, this time thinking about how the words must have sounded to everyone who heard them.

Day 3

We have so much to be thankful for when it comes to Jesus and the light He brought to the world.

Day 4

Where have you seen the light of Jesus?

Jesus’ light shows up in our lives in different ways. Sometimes it might be through His people—others who also follow Jesus. Other times, it might feel like it was something straight from God—like an unexplained peace during a really hard time.

Try to remember a time when someone shined the light of Jesus in your life. Then reach out to that person and thank them for showing compassion to you. If you can do it in person, that’s awesome! But you can also call them, text them, or write them a thank you note, expressing gratitude that they cared enough to do something about your needs.

Day 5
