

## Small Group Guide: "Family Life - How to Have Awesome Families"

**Opening Question:** What family tradition or activity do you look forward to the most, and why?

**Opening Prayer:** *Heavenly Father, we thank you for bringing us together today. As we dive into what it means to build strong, awesome families, we ask for your wisdom and guidance. Help us to learn from each other and from your Word so that we can apply these truths in our lives. In Jesus' name, amen.*

### Key Takeaways:

1. Great families don't happen by accident; they require planning and intentionality.
2. Values are caught more than taught; children learn primarily through the example set by their parents.
3. Understanding each family member's unique temperament is crucial for effective parenting and relationships.
4. Discipline should be done out of love, promoting growth rather than punishment.
5. Effective family communication involves more than surface-level conversations; it requires emotional engagement and understanding.
6. Conflict resolution, handling loss, and learning from failures are crucial skills that should be nurtured within the family dynamic.

### Discussion Questions:

1. Pastor Dan mentioned that great marriages and families don't happen by accident. What are some ways you've seen intentionality make a difference in family relationships?
2. **Read Nehemiah 4:14.** What does it mean for you to fight for your family in today's context?
3. **Read Proverbs 22:6.** This verse encourages us to train a child according to their bent or temperament. How can we identify and nurture the unique gifts and temperaments of our kids and family members?
4. **Read Proverbs 24:3.** In what ways does this verse inform your understanding of what builds a strong family foundation?
5. **Read Deuteronomy 6:7.** Discuss the importance of effective communication in a family—especially the command to discuss Godly values and spiritual growth. How can you integrate deeper “faith conversations” into your family’s daily routines?

6. **Read Hebrews 12:6.** This verse talks about God disciplining those He loves. In what ways can we reflect God's discipline in our approach to parenting or mentorship?

7. Pastor Dan talked about five areas families need to learn: handling feelings, conflict resolution, dealing with loss, values, and habits. Which of these areas do you think is most challenging for families today, and why?
8. The sermon touched on the impact of technology on family communication. How has technology affected communication in your family, both positively and negatively?
9. **Read Joshua 24:15.** How can you and your family demonstrate a commitment to serving the Lord in practical, everyday ways?

**Practical Applications:**

1. This week, try to have at least one deeper conversation with a family member, going beyond surface-level "news talk."
2. Reflect on your approach to discipline (whether with children, in relationships, or self-discipline). Is it more focused on punishment or growth? Make a plan to shift towards a growth-oriented approach.
3. Identify one area where your family could use more intentional planning (e.g., communication, shared activities, spiritual growth). Discuss and create a simple plan to address it.
4. Practice observing and understanding the unique "bent" or temperament of each family member. How can you tailor your interactions to better suit each person's needs?
5. As a family or couple, discuss and decide on core values you want to embody and pass on. How can you model these values more effectively?

**Closing Prayer:** Thank God for the insights gained from the sermon. Ask for wisdom and grace to implement these principles in your family life, and for God's guidance in becoming the family He desires you to be.
