Week 2 Personal Study Guide
Micah 3-4: Leaders With God's Heart

Purpose: This week we continue our journey through Micah by exploring chapters 3-4. Micah contrasts corrupt leadership with God's leadership and reminds us that God's people are called to represent His heart in the world.

Weekly Challenge: Am I representing God's heart where He has entrusted me with influence?

Day 1 – Remember Who God Is

Read:

Exodus 34:5-7

Micah 3:1-4

Reflect:

- Why does Micah begin by confronting the leaders?
- What stands out to you about God's character in Exodus 34?
- How were Israel's leaders acting differently from the God they claimed to represent?

Pray:

Ask God to help you know His heart so you can better represent Him.

Day 2 – Leadership and Influence

Read:

Micah 3:1-12

Reflect:

- What leadership failures does Micah expose?
- Why do you think God cares so deeply about leadership?
- Where has God entrusted you with influence?

Pray:

Ask God to help you steward your influence faithfully.

Day 3 – Filled with the Spirit

Read:

Micah 3:8

John 20:21-22

Galatians 5:22-25

Reflect:

- How is Micah different from the other leaders and prophets?
- What role does the Holy Spirit play in helping us represent God?
- Which fruit of the Spirit do you most need to grow in right now?

Pray:

Invite the Spirit to shape your character to reflect Jesus.

Day 4 – God's Design for Leadership

Read:

Psalm 72:1-7

John 10:10-15

1 Peter 5:1-4

Reflect:

- According to these passages, what is leadership designed to accomplish?
- How does Jesus model leadership differently than the world?
- What would it look like for people around you to flourish because of your influence?

Pray:

Ask God to make you a leader who serves rather than consumes.

Day 5 – When God Reigns

Read:

Micah 4:1-8

Reflect:

- What images of God's kingdom stand out to you?
- What does this passage teach us about peace, justice, and restoration?
- Where do you see glimpses of God's kingdom breaking into the world today?

Pray:

Pray for God's kingdom to come and His will to be done in your life.

Day 6 – Hope in the Darkness

Read:

Micah 4:9-13

Matthew 24:4-14

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Reflect:

- Why does Micah compare suffering to labor pains?
- What encouragement do these passages offer during difficult seasons?
- How can hardship become an opportunity to point others to Christ?

Pray:

Ask God to strengthen your faith and help you remain hopeful.

Day 7 – The God Who Gathers

Read:

Micah 4:6-8

Psalm 103:1-18

Romans 8:28-39

Reflect:

- Why do you think God chooses the lame, scattered, and weak?
- How have you experienced God's faithfulness in difficult seasons?
- What does it mean to trust God's purposes even when life is painful?

Pray:

Thank God that He gathers, restores, and works all things for His glory and our good.
