Opening Question

When you hear the word "surrender," what emotions or thoughts come to mind?

Looking Back

- What stood out most to you from Sunday's message?
- What part of Micah 5-7 impacted you the most?
- Looking back over the entire series, what has God taught you about Himself?

Digging Into Scripture

Read Micah 5:2-5

- Why was Israel's greatest need not simply better leadership but a better King?
- How does Jesus fulfill the role of Shepherd-King?
- What false sources of security do people often trust instead of God?

Read Micah 7:1-7

- What emotions do you hear in Micah's words?
- Why do you think Micah chooses to identify with the people rather than stand above them?
- How have you experienced the reality of human brokenness in your own life?

Read Micah 7:7-9

- What stands out about Micah's response to suffering and discipline?
- What is the difference between faith and wishful thinking?
- Why can believers have confidence even in dark seasons?

Read Micah 7:14

- Why is Micah's prayer so significant?
- What does this prayer teach us about humility?
- How does surrender relate to Micah 6:8 and walking humbly with God?

Read Micah 7:18-20

- Which description of God's character encourages you most?
- Why does Micah end the book with worship rather than more instructions?
- What does it mean that God "delights in faithful love"?

Living It Out

- Where are you most tempted to trust yourself instead of the Shepherd?
- How would your life look different if you truly believed God is faithful to His character?
- What is one practical step of surrender you want to take this week?

Prayer Time

Read Micah 7:18-20 aloud together, then invite each person to finish this sentence:

"Because there is no God like You, I will trust You with _____."

Close by thanking God for His faithfulness, compassion, justice, mercy, and love, and ask Him to help your group walk in deeper surrender to the Good Shepherd.
