

Psalm 67

Sermon Text: Psalm 67 (NASB 1995)

The Nations Exhorted to Praise God. For the choir director; with stringed instruments. A Psalm. A Song.

God be gracious to us and bless us,

And cause His face to shine upon us— *Selah*.

² That Your way may be known on the earth,

Your salvation among all nations.

³ Let the peoples praise You, O God;

Let all the peoples praise You.

⁴ Let the nations be glad and sing for joy;

For You will judge the peoples with uprightness

And guide the nations on the earth. *Selah*.

⁵ Let the peoples praise You, O God;

Let all the peoples praise You.

⁶ The earth has yielded its produce;

God, our God, blesses us.

⁷ God blesses us,

That all the ends of the earth may fear Him.

1. Read the text of Psalm 67 as a group. Consider first reading silently alone. Out loud as group with a designated reader. Consider praying through this passage of God's Word (i.e. Pray the Bible thanking God He has spoken to us so clearly, truthfully, mercifully, and sufficiently. We need no other word nor any other priest, prophet, leader, etc.)
2. What is the psalmists object of blessing in verse 1 and verse 6 and in what ways can we make this applicable in our day? Also look at verse 7. What is the nature or purpose of the blessing in this Psalm?
3. This psalm implicitly encourages the believer in an evangelistic way. When reading this psalm and reading Matthew 28:19, what tie can be made between these two texts? Think in terms of the physical and spiritual blessings that we receive from God. Are there any other evangelistic texts this psalm reminds you of?
4. What is the psalmist's response when blessing comes, and which we should follow?
5. How has this Psalm informed your prayer life? Share a few of these with each other and reflect.
