Course Descriptions:

BIB 400 Revelation (Professor: Dr. Sam Bailey):

The Revelation of Jesus Christ as prophetically experienced by John informs our understanding of the end times more than any other New Testament book. It also warns us to repent and to live for God. Since this message is intended for Christians, we need to understand it. Students will study the book in its entirety to make sense of its many unfamiliar and ambiguous elements.

BIB 203 Bible Atlas (Professor: Dr. Stace Cupples)

This course introduces the geography, archaeology, and historical landscapes of the Old and New Testaments through intensive engagement with a modern Bible atlas. Students will situate major biblical events on accurate maps; analyze regional features (topography, climate, routes) that shaped biblical narratives; and synthesize geographic insights with exegetical reading to enhance interpretation, teaching, and preaching. Emphasis is placed on visual literacy, spatial reasoning, and correlating places and periods across the biblical storyline. Understanding the world of the Bible—its roads, borders, terrains, and cities—is essential to sound interpretation. Geography clarifies why events occurred where and how they did, illuminates theological themes (e.g., exile and return, wilderness testing, temple-centered worship), and sharpens accuracy in preaching and teaching. This course equips students to use atlases, maps, and archaeological data responsibly so they can communicate Scripture with clarity and credibility in church, classroom, and missionary contexts.
