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Transportation Projects

The Pennyrile ADD Regional Transportation Committee reviews unfunded highway projects as part of the process of getting local input into developing Kentucky's Enacted Highway Plans. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet developed a prioritization process that is "data driven" and the Cabinet used this process to develop the 2022-2028 Enacted Highway Plan. PADD staff is charged with monitoring this process and keeping our local elected leaders informed on developments involving the new Highway plan.

Key projects throughout the Pennyrile region include the following:

- Completion of US 641 from Eddyville to Marion.
- Completion of upgrades and widening of US 79 from Todd to Logan County.
- Completion of I-69 in Kentucky including the Ohio River Crossing in Henderson.
- Funding for upgrades to the Breathitt Pennyrile Parkway bringing the parkway up to interstate standards in Christian County (I-169 Designation).
- Funding for upgrades to the Western Kentucky Parkway to an Interstate between the I-69/WK Interchange in Hopkins County to the I-165 Interchange in Ohio County.
- Funding for upgrades to the Western Kentucky Parkway bringing the parkway up to interstate standards in Hopkins, Muhlenberg, and Ohio Counties (I-569 Designation)

The Pennyrile ADD also supports legislation to ensure adequate and consistent long-term funding for transportation infrastructure. For more information, contact Angela Herndon at angelas.herndon@ky.gov or 270-886-9484.

Regional Initiatives

PADD supports many projects that are also priorities of our local and regional Chambers of Commerce. Projects such as Interstate 69 (completing of the Ohio River Crossing), Interstate 169 and 569, US 641, broadband development, West KY Law Enforcement Training Facility, and Hopkinsville and Madisonville Community College projects are examples of projects that continue to be priorities for the entire region. PADD also supports the work of the Southern Pennyrile Chamber Alliance, the West Kentucky Regional Chamber Alliance, C-Link, and Western Kentucky Coalition.

At the Federal level, the Pennyrile ADD supports providing resources essential to mission readiness at Fort Campbell. In addition, PADD supports the continued allocation of resources at the state and local level to military members transitioning into our workforce and to coal reliant communities through the Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Economic Development Program.

The COVID-19 pandemic fully exposed the deficiency of broadband connectivity in our rural region. Extended infrastructure needs and lower population densities create unique challenges for private industry to deliver services within an affordable framework on its own. The Pennyrile ADD supports legislation and funding that allows local cooperatives and other agencies to provide fiber internet access to those households where it is often not technically feasible and cost-effective for private internet service providers to provide service.

Area Agency on Aging & Independent Living

The Pennyrile Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living/Aging and Disability Resource Center is designated by the Commonwealth of Kentucky to develop and administer comprehensive programs and services which allow elderly, disabled individuals, and veterans choices, flexibility and access to services which allow them to maintain a quality level of independence to remain in their own homes and communities. The Pennyrile Area Agency on Aging currently provides in home and community based services to more than 15,000 elderly, disabled individuals, and veterans. There are approximately 575 individuals in need of in home services are on waiting lists. These numbers continue to increase each month for in home services such as personal care, homemaking and meals. It is proven that in home services cost less than institutional care and saves Medicaid dollars.

Support both from the Federal and State level to ensure adequate funding is necessary to support the ever growing demand for Aging and Independent Living programs.

The Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living currently has \$14,000,000 allocated to serve the elderly, disabled individuals and veterans throughout the nine county Pennyrile area.

The Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living was faced with the challenge of serving our most vulnerable populations during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Adjustments were made to our nutrition program to include curbside pickup for meals. The curbside option was very beneficial to our clients and remains as a service delivery option to access hot, nutritious meals. The additional funding from the state has also allowed us to add more individuals to the home delivered meal program.

West Kentucky Workforce

The West Kentucky Workforce Board (WKWB) provides training assistance to new and expanding industries for high -wage and high-demand occupations. The WKWB provides intensive coordination with the incentive programs of the Economic Development Cabinet - Bluegrass State Skills, Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) and Ky Chamber Workforce Network.

ACTION: Support coordinated funding at local levels to provide training assistance for Kentucky industry/business to ensure their greatest support. This coordination should also focus on funding to local Workforce Boards. (Tennessee provides funds for local Workforce Boards to assist new and expanding industry needs).

ACTION: Support the acceptance of military transitioning and veterans' experiences to Kentucky's qualifying occupational and licensure requirements in order to acknowledge their acquired knowledge and hands-on experience. Example: Military medic to Emergency Medical Transition.

The WKWB has approximately \$6 million in federal funds directed to specific populations and currently obligated to serve the needs of Kentucky's industries/businesses and citizens at this time.
