Regional Initiatives

Through the Joint Funding Agreement (JFA), PeADD provides essential planning, grant and loan-writing, and administrative support, helping local governments prepare competitive applications and successfully manage infrastructure, community development, and public-works investments. Ongoing support for JFA ensures PeADD can continue to provide those services, which are the foundation local governments rely on to secure state, federal, and private funds for community infrastructure and development.

Similarly, Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) planning services, including water, wastewater, and infrastructure priority planning, underpin long-term water and sewer investments across the region. Without robust planning, communities risk missing critical needs, misallocating funds, or delaying essential public health and infrastructure upgrades. Continued and increased investment in KIA-supported planning remains essential for long-term infrastructure stability and ensures communities stay eligible for low-interest loans and funding when ready to build.

By sustaining and boosting funding for JFA and KIA-supported planning, the state empowers local governments to plan strategically, leverage state and federal investments, and build infrastructure that spurs economic growth and improves residents' quality of life.

PeADD supports strengthening and fully funding the Kentucky GRANT Program so communities can continue to leverage federal dollars and move critical local projects forward. During the 2025 Regular Session, the General Assembly adopted several statutory changes intended to streamline the program and clarify eligible uses. PeADD encourages policymakers to maintain and grow recurring appropriations for the GRANT program. Stable, predictable funding allows local governments to plan ahead, assemble competitive federal applications, and close match gaps on transformational projects. Continued investment in the GRANT program ensures Kentucky communities can fully capitalize on federal resources and accelerate long-term economic and infrastructure development across the Commonwealth.

Projects such as Interstate 69 (completing of the Ohio River Crossing), Interstate 169 and 569, US 641, broadband development, West KY Law Enforcement Training Facility, and Hopkinsville and Madisonville Community College projects are examples of projects that continue to be priorities for the entire region. PeADD also supports the work of the West Kentucky Regional Chamber Alliance, Western Kentucky Coalition, and the School of Veterinary Medicine at Murray State University.

Transportation Planning

PeADD supports continued funding for regional transportation planning that supports safer roads, more efficient mobility, better freight connections, and improved access to jobs and services, all of which attract new employers and support economic growth. The PeADD Regional Transportation Committee reviews unfunded highway projects as part of the process of getting local input into developing Kentucky's Enacted Highway Plans. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet developed a prioritization process that is "data driven" and the Cabinet will use this process to develop the 2026-2032 Enacted Highway Plan. PeADD staff is charged with monitoring this process and keeping our local elected leaders informed on developments involving the new Highway plan.

PeADD supports major regional transportation investments that strengthen safety, mobility, and economic competitiveness. Key projects continue to include the I-24 Expansion Project, completion of US 641 from Eddyville to Fredonia, and widening US 79 between Todd and Logan Counties. Each of these corridors serves as a critical connector for freight movement, workforce access, and regional industry. Additional priorities include completing the Ohio River Crossing in Henderson and upgrading the Breathitt Pennyrile Parkway and Western Kentucky Parkway to achieve interstate designations (I-169 and I-569). These investments position the region for long-term growth and support statewide commerce.

Water / Wastewater Infrastructure

The Pennyryle Water Management Council has identified the region's priority drinking water and wastewater projects, totaling significant unmet infrastructure needs. The top 15 water and top 15 sewer projects represent more than \$256 million in required improvements across treatment, distribution, system capacity, and regulatory compliance. These priorities are established through Kentucky's statutory water management planning process and reflect input from utilities, engineers, and local governments. Clear distinctions between water and wastewater projects help ensure targeted investment and transparent communication of regional needs.

Health & Family Services

The Pennyriple Health & Family Services Department is designated as the Area Agency on Aging & Independent Living by the Commonwealth of Kentucky Department for Aging and Independent Living to develop and administer comprehensive programs and services which allow elderly, disabled individuals, caregivers and veterans choices, flexibility and access to services which allow them to maintain a quality level of independence to remain in their own homes and communities.

Support from the Federal and State level to ensure adequate funding is available to support the growing demand for Health & Family Services programs including:

- Adequate Funding for Aging Services
- Access to Home and Community Based Services
- Support for Affordable and Accessible Housing
- Transportation
- Mental and Physical Health Programs
- Elder Justice Programs
- Nutrition Programs
- Caregiver and Family Support Programs

The Pennyriple Health & Family Services Department currently serves approximately 4,000 clients with a total budget of \$46,460,809. Local waiting lists for services including home delivered meals, homemaking and personal care exceeds 575 requests.

By pursuing these legislative priorities, Pennyriple Health & Family Services programs aim to empower older adults to maintain independence, improve their quality of life and ensure that caregivers and families receive the support they need.

West Kentucky Workforce

The West Kentucky Workforce Board (WKWB) provides training support for new and expanding industries in high-wage, high-demand fields. WKWB works closely with the Economic Development Cabinet's incentive programs, Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS), and the Kentucky Chamber Workforce Network. The WKWB manages roughly \$5.3 million in state and federal funds to meet the needs of West Kentucky employers and jobseekers by:

- Strengthening coordinated local funding to deliver training assistance for West Kentucky businesses and sustain the work of local Workforce Boards.
- Anchoring veteran workforce services for the region through a full-time WKWB Veterans Liaison stationed at Fort Campbell. This position connects transitioning soldiers and spouses to civilian careers and fills employer demand for skilled talent. Dedicated funding is needed to maintain this direct link between the installation and West Kentucky's workforce pipeline.
- Supporting youth across the Pennyriple region through four contractors offering specialized career counseling, short-term training and expanded paid work experience.
- Leading the "Putting Young Kentuckians to Work" initiative, which addresses the unmet needs of disconnected young adults ages 16–24. PYKW provides on-the-job training and short-term skill development and is currently serving more than 135 young adults in West Kentucky. Continued investment is essential to keep these young adults connected to work and to meet employer demand for entry-level talent.

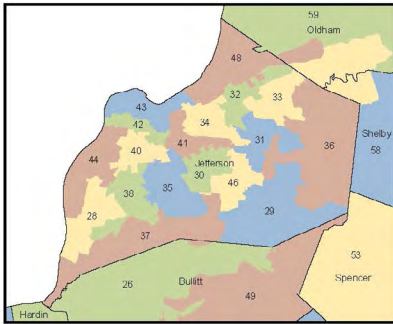

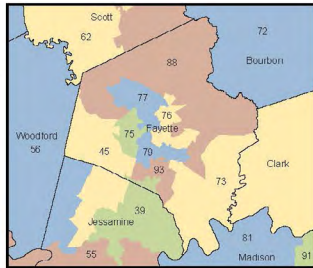

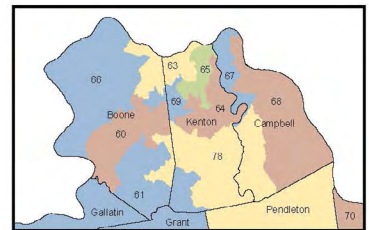
Senate & House District Maps



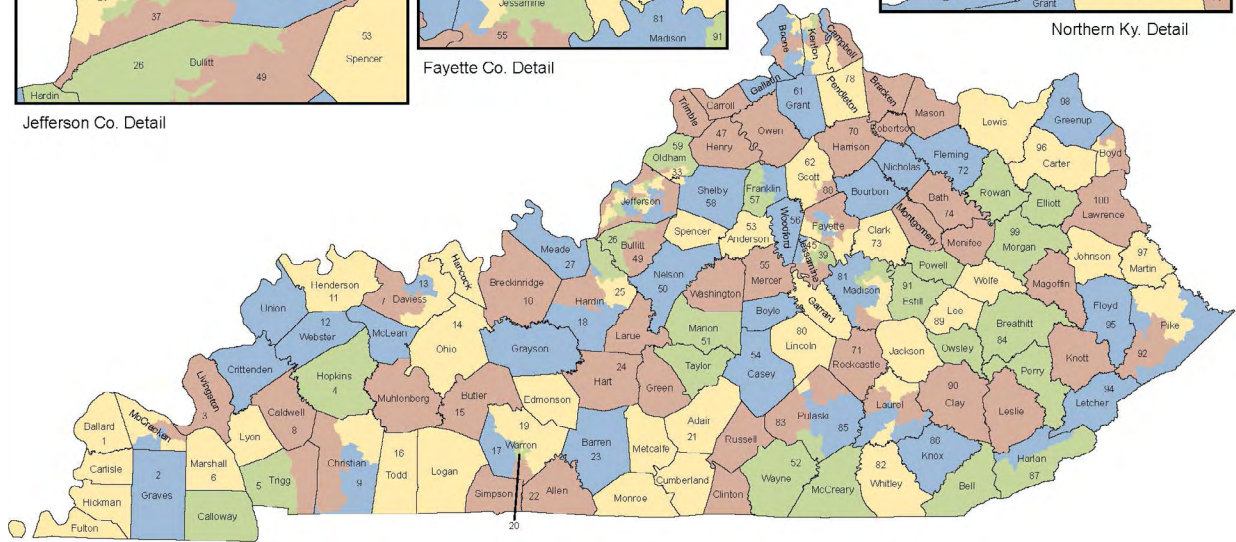
Jefferson Co. Detail

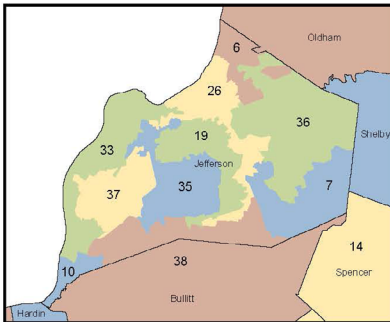

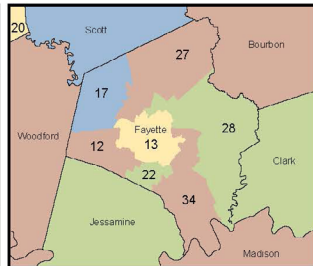

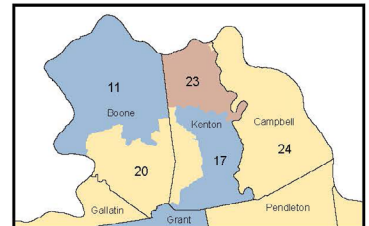
House Plan (HH002C03) became law (KRS 5.201 – 5.300) January 20, 2022, with enactment of House Bill 2.



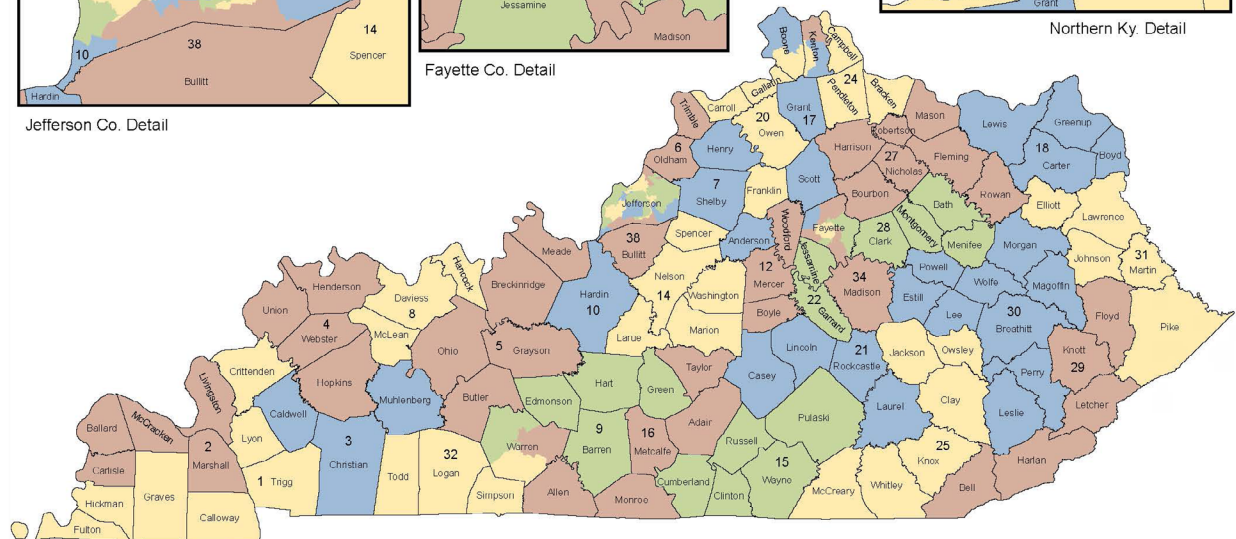
