District 1 Highway Project Update

Kyle Poat provided the KYTC District 1 Update

US641

Mr. Poat explained that the project spans Crittenden, Caldwell, and Lyon Counties. The 641 corridor that would tie into the section already constructed in Crittenden County. A final meeting is planned for mid-to-late July during which the right of way plans will be shared followed by the right of way acquisition phase for the remaining pieces of that corridor.

KY295

The project involves the elevation of a section that floods. The project is in the early design phase. Additional information will be forthcoming as the projects develop.

US60

They are still working on the turning lane in front of the high school and hospital on Highway 60 in Marion. The project has been let several times in the past and is being let again on April 27, 2023. They are hopeful that the bids come in that allow them to award that project. In Livingston county, the section of US 60 coming off of the Ledbetter bridge is scheduled for another public meeting for the end of June for that project where a new proposed alignment to tie into US60 will be shared.

KY139/KY124

The intersection at KY139/KY124 northeast of Cadiz is in the right of way acquisition phase. Approximately half of the right away has been purchased. The project was paused briefly to work on adding in the sidewalk element for the Dollar General store. A letting review meeting was held April 25, 2023 at the D1 office. The project has been delayed to a September construction letting for that project.

Kyle Poat also referenced a return to focus on bridge projects.

District 2 Highway Project Update

The updated was provided by Deneatra Henderson from KYTC D2

New Pembroke Connector

There have been regular meetings with stakeholders. There was a Meeting on April 25th. The project was let and was awarded to Rogers Group in March. They are finalizing the drainage plans for the Railroad bridge and the peace north up to US 41 and hope to have the letting sometime this summer.

115 Widening

The widening of 115 from the connector south to I-24 is the right of way phase of one phase and the second phase does not yet have adequate funding. The goal of D2 is to combine the projects for a total of 6 miles. D2 believes that all 6 miles can be widened if the project is delayed to wait for the necessary funding.

I24 Widening

The CUAMPO meeting included discussion on this project. D2 has sponsored that first section of the widening due to the need and the anticipated cost.

District 3 Highway Project Update

There was no representative present from D3.

Crittenden County

Judge Newcom made a motion to sponsor two (2) projects identified as IP20190133 and IP20230107 in the meeting packet. The motion was seconded by Amanda Davenport; All ayes; Motion carried.

Hopkins County


