SUB STANCE

Sub means 'under' and Stance means 'stand' so the word Substance means to 'stand under'. Today we hear in the Preface that God is a 'Trinity of Substance'... the reality that 'stands under' the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit is **God** – each of the Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity are of the same substance (they are Consubstantial). On this Trintiy Sunday let's pray for a deeper appreciation of this Mystery of God – one in three and three in one.

Bishops of England & Wales

The Bishops of England and Wales have written to update us on the situation with COVID restrictions and our obligation to attend Mass.

"We believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply"....

We come to Mass because we love God and we love our neighbour.

We show we love God by doing what He said: 'Do this in Memory of me' and we show our neighbour we love them by gathering with them and supporting them by our presence – we witness together.

Attending Mass on Sunday and other Holidays is not only an act of love but is also an obligation.... It is the THIRD COMMANDMENT.

Like all the 10 Commandments, if we wilfully and deliberately break that Commandment we commit the most serious of sins called a MORTAL SIN, which means we must go to Confession, to be reconciled with God at our earliest opportunity as a matter of urgency.

During the COVID pandemic it wasn't possible to attend Mass and even since the relaxation of the restrictions there may have been health problems preventing some people from attending Mass.

But now, from Pentecost Sunday, the Obligation returns which means if we deliberately miss Holy Mass on Sunday or any Holy Day of Obligation, we must confess our sin BEFORE receiving Holy Communion again.


REMINDER: The Saturday Vigil Mass (6pm every week) fulfils our obligation, so we can attend Mass at either Mass:

6pm on Saturdays or 10am on Sundays

Holy Day of obligation Mass times are:

VIGIL MASS: 7pm

FEAST DAY 10am

and all you have created rightly

to all things and make them holy,

to all things and make them holy, and you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.

Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration, that they may become the Body and + Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate these mysteries.

At the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer, the Priest addresses God the **Father**, asking that the **Holy Spirit** my come down from heaven upon the gifts of bread and wine, so that those gifts may really and truly become God the **Son**.

This moment is called the 'epiclesis'.

This is the moment we call on God – the Blessed Trintiy – to act, that we may participate in these Divine Mysteries which belong in heaven but, by God's grace and love, we are permitted to participate in here and now on earth.

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes with the 'doxology' (which means appearance or to see glory).

The image below shows the doxology during Mass. At this moment, the gifts of bread and wine have been transformed by the Blessed Trintiy and now the priest is holding God the Son.

This is the moment we see God's glory – His Glory shines upon us.

'Through Him, with Him and in Him' the priest says to God the Father, referring to the one he is holding, Jesus.....

Through **Him** (Jesus), With Him (Jesus) and in Him (Jesus) O God almighty **Father**, in the unity of the **Holy Spirit**, all <u>glory</u> and honour is for ever and ever, AMEN.

So, the Eucharistic Prayer ends, just as it begins, with honouring the Blessed Trintiy.



This change of bread and wine into God the Son is called Transubstantiation which means:

TRANS = Change

Sub = Under

Stance = Standing

= a change of the reality that stands under the appearance.... There is no more bread left, only Jesus. Every single crumb, every particle is no longer bread but has become Jesus really and truly.
