Our worship begins with a scriptural call for God's people to worship. In this way, our gathered worship is a conversation initiated by God between himself and his people.

† CALL TO WORSHIP Psalm 16:2, 5-6, 8-11

Leader: Say to the Lord, "You are my Lord; I have no good apart from You."

People: The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup; You hold my lot. The lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; indeed, I have a beautiful inheritance.

Leader: Therefore my heart is glad, and my whole being rejoices; my flesh also dwells secure.

People: For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol or let Your holy one see corruption. I have set the Lord always before me; because He is at my right hand, I shall not be shaken.

Leader: You make known to me the path of life; in Your presence there is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

† **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

The Apostles' Creed

Leader: Let us declare together what we believe the Scriptures teach. Christian, what do you believe?

All: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

GOD CLEANSSES US
Within the context of our relationship with God, we are invited in safety, not shame, to consider our sins. God loves us in spite of our sins. We rehearse this truth each week by confessing our sins corporately and leaning into his renewal, restoration, and cleansing.

RESPONSIVE CONFESSION OF SIN..... Based on Romans 2:1-4, 6-8

Leader: Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God?

People: So, Lord, we come confessing.

Leader: Or do you presume on the riches of His kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?

People: So, Lord, we come confessing.

Leader: He will render to each one according to his works: to those who by patience in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, He will give eternal life; but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury.

All: So, Lord, we come confessing.¹
