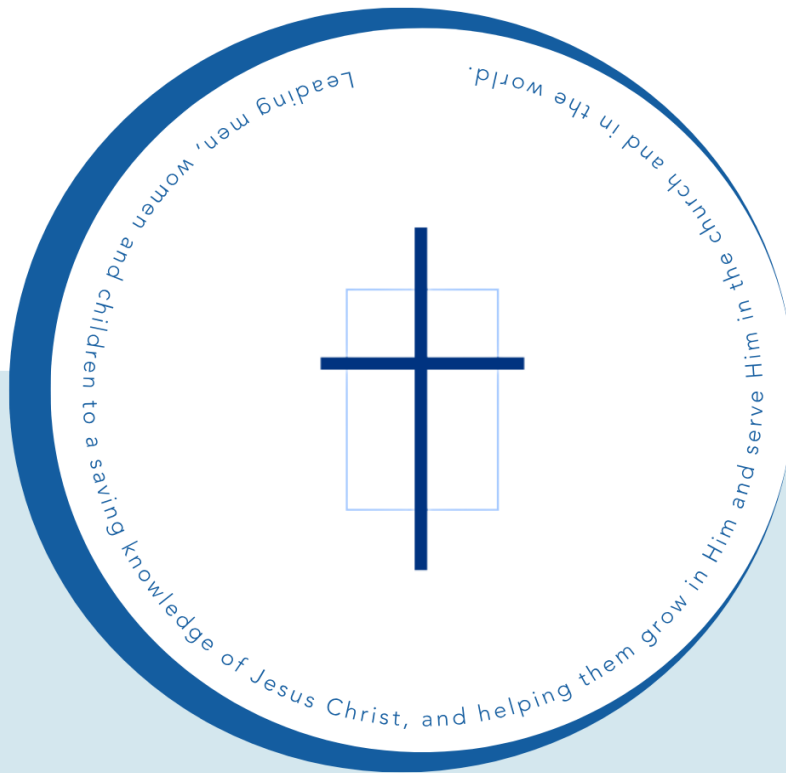

† **CONFESSION OF FAITH** The Heidelberg Catechism, Q. No. 74

Leader: Let us declare together what we believe the Scriptures teach: Should infants, too, be baptized?

All: Yes, Infants as well as adults are in God’s covenant and are his people. They, no less than adults, are promised the forgiveness of sin through Christ’s blood and the Holy Spirit who produces faith. Therefore, by baptism, the mark of the covenant, infants should be received into the Christian church and should be distinguished from the children of unbelievers. This was done in the Old Testament by circumcision, which was replaced in the New Testament by baptism.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Leader: Let us now confess our sins together before our God:

All: “Lord Jesus, help us to give up every precious lust on which we squander our longings. We have treasured many objects above our Savior and have carefully nurtured storehouses of idols that demand our worship. Forgive us for accumulating riches and finding our salvation, joy, and identity in them. When you give us good gifts, we are prone to love them too much and cling to them, instead of thanking you for them and clinging to you. We rejoice too much in the wealth you send, and we despair too much when you take it away. Father, forgive us.”¹ In Christ’s name. Amen.
