







The Early History of Nasagieweya - compiled by Joshua Norrish 1889.


from meetings. It is from those treasured newsy-bits that the content for this book has been taken. Transcribed and compiled by member, Joy Simpson ... \$25 ☐



Nassagaweya

The majority of History of Nassagaweya is taken from "The Early History of Nasagaweya" by Joshua Norrish. He wrote the history as he remembered from 1850 until 1888 and describes as:

"Nasagaweya— meaning dividing of the waters—lies on the north west corner of the County of Halton, bounded on the south east by Nelson, south west by Puslinch, and north west by Eramosa, and the north east by Esquesing. It is twelve miles long by six miles wide divided into seven double fronted concessions containing thirty two lots of two hundred acres each. Nassagaweya was surveyed in 1819 and the original spelling was 'Nasagaweya'.

Some of the well known hamlets of the former Township of Nassagaweya are Campbellville, Moffat Haltonville, Knatchbull, Darbyville, Brookville .
