This form is for any camps or retreats taken with WayPoint Youth.

1. **Be reasonable and cooperative with any staff**, and we will do our part to give you every chance to have an absolute blast at camp and to be affected positively by the message.
2. **Watch out for each other and be respectful.** Anything that intentionally hurts someone else, be it physically or verbally, will not be tolerated.
3. **Obviously, no weapons or drugs are allowed at all**, with the exception of prescription drugs, which will be administered by the camp staff. This is a zero-tolerance requirement. Violation of this requirement results in an unsafe environment to students and leaders who wish to learn and grow, and will result in immediate expulsion from camp without a refund, no exceptions.

Initial here confirming that you have not brought any weapons or illegal substances to camp:

4. **NO CELLPHONES:** To keep consistent with the unplugged and disconnected nature of camp, campers will not be allowed any cell phones or any other personal electronic devices. This includes: Tablets, smartwatches, music players, and anything else that has a screen that could be a distraction. If you need to contact parents or have emergencies, youth leaders will have phones available. Any such devices will be confiscated at the start of camp and kept safe until the end of camp. Digital cameras are allowed *if it is just a camera*.

PS: THIS INCLUDES students who want to use their phones to help fall asleep! Camp is meant to be a significant break from the norm. You'll survive. Initial here confirming that you left your phone (and any other personal electronics) at home, or have given it to a youth leader at drop off:

5. If you think you need your phone for something specific, just let us know. We can make arrangements.

Dress Code:

At all times, your clothing should be appropriate, respectful, and comfortable for the activity at hand. Obviously, this means there is a different standard for indoor meetings, outdoor activities and sports, sleeping, and swimming. Never wear anything offensive, provocative, or that otherwise attracts inappropriate attention.

Here's some specifics we want you to know about:

1. **No booty shorts** - We don't want to see your butt cheeks.
2. **Swimwear: No string bikinis, no speedos** - Opt for something more secure, and that fully covers sensitive areas. If unsure, ask a youth leader of the same gender.
3. **Shirts must always be worn indoors and during large group activities** - For all mealtimes, team sports, or large group activities, you should be fully clothed.
4. In any situation, youth leaders may find it necessary to ask you to change into something else, even if you think it is already ok. The primary goal with our dress code is your own self-respect and dignity. We do not want anyone feeling shame or condemnation for their body, as we firmly believe that your body is a temple, worthy of respect. Please do your best to abide by these new rules, for your own benefit, and the example for others.
