


PAPAKAIO SCHOOL BOARD



Whitestone meats (Jeff Wright) is kindly donating sausages again this year and Aka Taupo is donating the bread – thanks team!





GEAR



When they run out, get in touch, we have a plan! You will need two towels, sleeping bag and pillow, clothes for Saturday night (comfy, casual & warm!).

FOOD & ACCOMMODATION

We will be staying two nights at Lakeland Park on Kelvin Heights Peninsula. Our adult leaders will cook and we will provide all Saturday's meals and Sunday breakfast & lunch.
