Also, I encourage you to sponsor one of our kids doing the famine.







When they run out, get in touch, we have a plan! You will need two towels, sleeping bag and pillow, clothes for Saturday night (comfy, casual & warm!).

### FOOD & ACCOMMODATION

We will be staying two nights at Lakeland Park on Kelvin Heights Peninsula. Our adult leaders will cook and we will provide all Saturday's meals and Sunday breakfast & lunch. However, Friday dinner is NOT included in the cost. Youth will need to bring their own tea or, as we usually do, pre-order fish/hot dog & chips so we don't go hungry.
