Nominations close at noon on Friday **25th June 2021** and may be accompanied by signed candidate's statements.


The Voting Roll is open for inspection at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.



Costs: \$100.00 per player (includes accommodation, sit down lunch, dinner, cooked breakfast and packed lunch)


