**Dominica**, not to be confused with the Dominican Republic, is the Caribbean's best kept secret. Dominica is a small (275 sq. mile) island located in the Eastern Caribbean, between the French islands of Martinique and Guadeloupe. "Lonely Planet" named Dominica as one of the top ten places to travel in the world. With a population of 68,910, its main industries are tourism and agriculture. Although Dominica is known for its mountains, rainforest and waterfalls, it also has a number of beautiful beaches and picturesque coastal formations (this is where "Pirates of the Caribbean" was filmed). Its towering mountains, lush green forests and winding rivers are practically begging for exploration. Whereas all the other volcanic islands of the Lesser Antilles have only one active volcano, Dominica has nine and yet there has been no major magmatic eruption since Columbus visited the island in 1493 and, as a result, it has today the best and most extensively preserved tropical rainforests. But if you've heard of this island, you know that you don't visit for only the resorts and beaches. Instead, Dominica attracts the adventurous eco-tourist that treasures authenticity while on vacation. The island is considered one of the most pristine and well-preserved spots in the Western Hemisphere. This makes Dominica's many unique natural features great destinations for outdoors and nature enthusiasts, as well as shutterbugs.

Since it's known as the "Nature Island" of the Caribbean, it's no surprise that the topography of the underwater world mirrors the diverse landscapes above. The high mountain peaks above the water create dramatic drop offs, steep walls, canyons and pinnacles below that you can explore while scuba diving in Dominica. Dominica is the only country in the world, in which sperm whales reside year round.

### **Fort Young Hotel**

Set upon Dominica's most storied property, Fort Young Hotel embraces a rich and soulful history that reinforces the hotel's welcoming and homely ambiance. While the hotel first opened in 1964, the land upon which it sits dates back to 1699. Having evolved from a military fort to a central police station and, presently, a hotel, the land has been inundated with an undeniable sense of character; a colorful and cultural vibrancy that defines Fort Young Hotel. Located in Roseau, Dominica's capital and only "downtown," Fort Young Hotel sits in the main marina with the ferry port and market just a minute's walk from its entrance, yet affords its guests a luxurious sense of seclusion. From your room's oceanfront balcony, the sights and sounds of the capital vanish, replaced by the gentle lapping of waves and endless expanse of the sea and sky.

The dive operation consists of a fully-stocked dive retail shop, teaching facilities, rental gear room, rinse tanks, camera tables and outdoor showers—all located dockside for convenient boat access. Fort Young Dive's boats depart multiple times a day to the island's various dive sites and can easily accommodate both divers and crew with a spacious deck, dedicated camera table, dry storage, fresh water shower, head and large rinse buckets.
