CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. Registration

All members must be registered before being admitted to conference meetings.

2. Credentials

- (a) The Credentials Committee shall provide identification badges for voting delegates, Soroptimist members and guests at the time of registration.
- (b) Identification badges shall be worn at all times and are not transferable.
- (c) Should a delegate be absent or unable to serve, the alternate shall assume the duties of the delegate AFTER qualifying at the registration and credentials desks.

These duties shall be retained throughout the conference.

3. Seating

- (a) There shall be a designated seating area for delegates.
- (b) Attendees shall be seated five minutes before each session convenes.
- (c) The doors shall be closed when each session convenes; those awaiting admittance at a later time shall be admitted at the discretion of the pages.

4. Smoking

There shall be no smoking during business sessions and meal functions of this conference as a courtesy to those in attendance.

5. Communications

All communications for those seated at the platform and members of the assembly, shall be delivered by an official page.

6. Motions

Main motions and amendments shall be written on the official form provided, signed and sent to the Chair by page.

7. Debate

Debate shall be limited to two minutes for each speaker, and ten minutes for each question, except when permitted otherwise by the voting assembly by a two-thirds vote. No member may speak more than twice to the same question, except by consent of the voting assembly.

8. Decorum

- (a) All meetings will be called to order on time.
- (b) The Chair at all times shall be addressed as Governor Lorraine.
- (c) A delegate or other member shall rise, address the Chair and having been recognized, shall state her name and the name of her club distinctly, making use of the microphone provided.
- (d) No delegate or officer shall leave the meeting room unless excused by the Chair.
- (e) The Chair shall recognize each member desiring the floor in proper order.
- (f) Both delegates and non-delegates shall be allowed the privilege of the floor. Precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- (g) Regional committee chairmen and/or members of regional committees shall be allowed to speak in debate on a motion, with consent of the delegates, if they are speaking to an issue affecting their committee or to an issue proposed by their committee and which was sent with the Call to Conference.

9. Publicity

No discussion or action shall be released for publicity without the approval of the Regional Governor.

10. Recording Devices

Recording devices shall not be used during the conference without written consent of the Regional

FOUNDER REGION ANNUAL AWARDS

VIOLET RICHARDSON WARD - "Service to Youth" Award

This award is presented to the club judged to have the most outstanding YOUTH project. The award is presented annually at the Regional Conference in honor of the Founder President of Soroptimist. This is a traveling award.

JULIA "BESS" COMBS EXTENSION AWARD

This award donated by Soroptimist International of Santa Rosa, is a traveling award and is presented to the club having the largest net increase in active membership during the year from April 1 through March 31, and may include charter membership of a new club sponsored by a club. The results are determined by the regional treasurer's records.

JULIA "BESS" COMBS MEMBERSHIP INCREASE AWARD

This award, donated by Julia "Bess" Combs, is a traveling award and is presented to the club having the largest net increase in active membership during the year from April 1 through March 31, and may not include membership of a newly chartered club sponsored by a club.

ELOISE B. CUSHING MEMORIAL AWARD

This award, donated by Soroptimist International of Oakland, in honor of their charter member, is a traveling award. The award is presented annually to the club judged to have the most outstanding Soroptimist orientation/education programs for the year. The applications are judged by the Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training Committee of Founder Region. The award is presented by the chairman of the Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training Committee.

SOROPTIMIST FOUNDATION awards

YOUTH CITIZENSHIP AWARDS - Y.C.A.

The Youth Citizenship Award is supported by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. Youth Citizenship Award program is administered in the following manner. Application is open to young men and women graduating from public or private high school not later than the close of the school year in June. Application begins at the club level, with local awards optional. Applications of the club awardees are fowarded to the district level for judging. There is a cash award presented by the region of \$500.00 to each of six district awardees. The district awardee applications are forwarded to the regional chairman for judging. The regional awardees are awarded \$1250.00, two awards to be presented each year. Regional awardee applications are forwarded to the federal level to be judged with awardees from 26 other regions for the Federation Foundation "Award to Merit" of \$2000.00. On all levels of judging, judges are invited to participate who are non-Soroptimists.

TRAINING AWARDS PROGRAM - T.A.P.

The Training Awards Program is supported by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. and is designed to assist mature women in upward mobility and in their efforts toward retraining and to re-entry into the labor market. Application begins at the club level, with local awards optional. Applications of the club awardees are forwarded to the district level for judging. There is a cash award presented by the region of \$500.00 to each of six district awardees. The district awardee applications are forwarded to the regional chairman for judging. The regional awards are awarded \$3000.00, two awards presented each year. Regional awardee applications are forwarded to the federal level to be judged with awardees from 26 other regions for the Federation Foundation award of \$10,000.00. On all levels of judging, judges are invited to participate who are non-Soroptimists.

SOROPTIMIST YOUTH FORUM

The Soroptimist Youth Forum program is supported by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas at the federation level. Clubs are encouraged to hold local forums and the region holds a regional forum which has been held traditionally once each biennium. This is a forum for youth people to meet and discuss societal issues in keeping with the federation Youth Forum theme. Participants in the federation forum must be between the ages of 16 and 19. Selection of participants for the regional and federation forums are made by the participants themselves. At the club level there is no limitation on how many participants there may be. At the regional level, the region decides how many participants there will be. At the federation level, there may be only two participants per region. At the club and regional level, there are normally no monetary awards, however traditionally there have been certificates of appreciation. At the federation level, expenses to the forum for round trip transportation are provided as well as housing and meals while traveling and at the forum location. These funds are provided through the Soroptimist Foundations.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE FOR WOMEN AWARDS

There are two awards presently within Founder Region. One award is given to honor a woman who has shown great achievement within her field of endeavor. The second award is given to honor a woman who has consistently and effectively used her resources, talents and influence to help other women to acheive their potential. These awards shall be presented annually at regional conference. The regional chairman of the Human Rights/Status of Women Committee is responsible for distributing criteria forms to the clubs and arranging for three non-Soroptimist judges to determine the regional awardees. The Human Rights/Status of Women regional chairman shall present the awards. She shall arrange for the purchase of gifts, within the limitations of the committee budget, and prepare certificates of recognition. These awards honor women who have worked to advance the status of women. They may or may not be Soroptimists.

BARBARA STEVENSON "S" CLUB ENDOWMENT AWARD

This award is presented to those judged as outstanding senior members of "S" Clubs in Founder Region. Funds are obtained from the Barbara Stevenson "S" Club Endowment Fund, interest only from this fund to be used for the awards. The awards are announced at the annual "S" Club Conference, and are presented at the regional conference. Selection of the awardees is made by the Founder Region "S" Club Committee. Contributions to the Founder Region Barbara Stevenson "S" Club Endowment Fund may be made by transmitting them to the regional treasurer. The award was named for Barbara Stevenson, a member of Soroptimist International of Alameda who for many years devoted much time and talent to the sucess of S Clubs.

FOUNDER REGION FELLOWSHIP INC. FELLOWSHIPS/GRANTS IN AID

Founder Region Fellowship Inc. is a non-profit, incorporated entity of Founder Region. There are six elected directors who serve on the board of Founder Region Fellowship Inc., one from each district of Founder Region. The President of the Board of Directors is appointed by the Founder Region Governor each biennium. Fellowships of not less than \$5000.00 and Grants-in-Aid in lesser amounts are awarded to graduate women for the purpose of encouraging women students to prepare for careers in public service, international relations, political science, languages, medicine, sociology and other areas of study. Awards are granted to women working toward doctoral degrees, preferably in the last year of study. An applicant must be enrolled in a university within Founder Region which offers doctoral programs. These awards are administered through Founder Region Fellowship, Inc. Each member of Founder Region yearly contributes \$2.00 by mandatory assessment. Clubs of the region are encouraged to hold special fundraisers known as "Fun for Fellowship" to help support the program and individuals, clubs and districts become fellows of the Founder Region Fellowship, Inc. by contributing \$1000.00 or more to the program.
