CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. Registration

All members must be registered before being admitted to conference meetings.

2. Credentials

(a) The Credentials Committee shall provide identification badges for voting delegates,

Soroptimist members and guests at the time of registration.

- (b) Identification badges shall be worn at all times and are not transferable.
- (c) Should a delegate be absent or unable to serve, the alternate shall assume the duties of the delegate AFTER qualifying at the registration and credentials desks. These duties shall be retained throughout the conference.

3. Seating

- (a) There shall be a designated seating area for delegates.
- (b) Attendees shall be seated five minutes before each session convenes.
- (c) The doors shall be close when each session convenes; those awaiting admittance at a later time shall be admitted at the discretion of the pages.

4. Smoking

There shall be no smoking at any function of this conference as a courtesy to those in attendance.

5. Communications

All communications for those seated at the platform and members of the assembly shall be delivered by an official page.

6. Motions

Main motions and amendments shall be written on the official form provided, signed and sent to the chair by page.

7. Debate

Debate shall be limited to two minutes for each speaker, and ten minutes for each question, except when permitted otherwise by the voting assembly by a two-thirds vote.

No member may speak more than twice to the same question, except by consent of the voting assembly.

8. Decorum

- (a) All meetings will be called to order on time.
- (b) The Chair at all times shall be addressed as Governor Patti.
- (c) A delegate or other member shall rise, address the Chair and having been recognized, shall state her/his name and the name of her/his club distinctly, making use of the microphone provided.
- (d) No delegate or officer shall leave the meeting room unless excused by the Chair.
- (e) The Chair shall recognize each member desiring the floor in proper order.
- (f) Both delegates and non-delegates shall be allowed the privilege of the floor. Precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- (g) Regional committee chairmen shall be accorded precedence of the floor at the discretion of the Chair, with the consent of the delegates, if they are speaking to an issue affecting their committee, or to an issue proposed by their committee and which was sent with the Call to Conference.

9. Publicity

No discussion or action shall be released for publicity without the approval of the Regional Governor.

10. Recording Devices

Recording devices shall not be used during the conference without written consent of the Regional Governor.

CORRECTIONS TO STANDING RULES

FOUNDER REGION ANNUAL AWARDS

VIOLET RICHARDSON WARD "Service to Youth" Award

This award is presented to the club judged to have the most outstanding YOUTH project. The award is presented annually at the Regional Conference in honor of the Founder President of Soroptimist. This is a traveling award that was established by Soroptimist International of Berkeley.

JULIA "BESS" COMBS EXTENSION AWARD

This award donated by Soroptimist International of Santa Rosa is a traveling award and is presented to the club having the largest net increase in active membership during the year from April l through March 3l, and may include charter membership of a new club sponsored by a club. The results are determined by the regional treasurer's records.

JULIA "BESS" COMBS MEMBERSHIP INCREASE AWARD

This award, donated by Julia "Bess" Combs, is a traveling award and is presented to the club having the largest net increase in active membership during the year from April I through March 31 and may not include membership of a newly charter club sponsored by a club.

ELOISE B. CUSHING MEMORIAL AWARD

This award, donated by Soroptimist International of Oakland, in honor of their charter member, is a traveling award. The award is presented annually to the club judged to have the most outstanding Soroptimist orientation/education programs for the year. The applications are judged by the Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training Committee for Founder Region. The award is presented by the chairman of the Soroptimist Orientation and Leadership Training Committee.

SOROPTIMIST FOUNDATION AWARDS

YOUTH CITIZENSHIP AWARDS

The Youth Citizenship Award (YCA) is funded by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. Youth Citizenship Award program is administered in the following manner. Application is open to young men and women graduating from public or private high school not later than the close of the school year in June. Application begins at the club level, with local awards optional. Applications of the club awardees are forwarded to the district level for judging. There is a cash award presented by the region of \$500.00 to each of the six district awardees. The district awardees applications are forwarded to the regional chairman for judging. The regional awardees are awarded \$1,250.00, funded by the SIA Foundation two awards to be presented each year. Regional awardee applications are forwarded to the federation level to be judged with awardees from 26 other regions for the Federation Foundation "Award of Merit" of \$2,000.00. On all levels of judging, judges are invited to participate who are non-Soroptimists.

TRAINING AWARDS PROGRAM

The Training Awards Program (TAP) is funded by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. and is designed to assist mature women in upward mobility and in their efforts toward training for re-entry into the labor market. Application begins at the club level, with local awards optional. Applications of the club awardees are forwarded to the district level for judging. There is a cash award presented by the region of \$500.00 to each of six district awardees. The district awardee applications are forwarded to the regional chairman for judging. The regional awards are \$3,000.00. These are funded by the SIA Foundation and two awards to be presented each year. Regional awardee applications are forwarded to the federation level to be judged with awardees from 26 other regions for the Federation Foundation award of \$10,000.00. On all levels of judging, judges are invited to participate who are non-Soroptimists.

SOROPTIMIST YOUTH FORUM

The Soroptimist Youth Forum program is funded by the Foundation of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. at the federation level. Clubs are encouraged to hold local forums and the region holds a regional forum which has been held traditionally once each biennium. Participants in the federation forum must be between the ages of 16 and 19. Selection of participants for the regional and federation forums are made by the participants themselves. At the club level there is no limitation on how many participants there may be. At the regional level, the region decides how many participants there will be. At the federation level, there may be only two participants per region. At the club and regional level, there are normally no monetary awards, however, traditionally there have been certificates of appreciation. At the federation level, expenses to the forum for round trip transportation are provided as well as housing and meals while traveling and at the forum location. These funds are provided through the Soroptimist Foundation.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE FOR WOMEN AWARDS

There are two awards presently with Founder Region. One award is given to honor a woman who has shown great achievement within her field of endeavor. The second award is given to honor a woman who has consistently and effectively used her resources, talents and influence to help other women to achieve their potential. These awards shall be presented annually at the regional conference. The regional chairman of the Human Rights/Status of Women Committee is responsible for distribution criteria forms to the clubs and arranging for three non-Soroptimist judges to determine the regional awardees. The Human Rights/Status of Women regional chairman shall present the awards. She shall arrange for the purchase of gifts, within the limitations of the committee budget, and prepare certificates of recognition. These awards honor women who have worked to advance the status women. They may or may not be Soroptimists.

BARBARA STEVENSON "S" CLUB ENDOWMENT AWARD

This award is presented to those judged as outstanding senior members of "S" Clubs in Founder Region. Funds are obtained from the Barbara Stevenson "S" Club Endowment Fund, interest only from this funds to be used for the awards. The awards are announced at the annual "S" Club Conference, and are presented at the regional conference. Selection of the awardees is made by the Founder Region "S" Club Committee. Contributions to the Founder Region Barbara Stevenson "S" Club Endowment Fund may be made by transmitting them to the regional treasurer. The award was named for Barbara Stevenson, a member of Soroptimist International of Alameda who for many years devoted much time and talent to the success of "S" Clubs.

FOUNDER REGION FELLOWSHIP, INC. FELLOWSHIPS/GRANTS IN AID

Founder Region Fellowship, Inc. is a non-profit, incorporated entity within Founder Region S.I.A. There are elected Directors seated as the board, one from each District in the Region. The President is appointed by the Founder Region Governor-elect in the second year of the biennium. Fellowships and Grants in Aid, at this time \$20,000.00, are awarded each year to graduate women in the last phase of their studies in a university, which offers a doctoral degree, within the boundaries of Founder Region. It is our hope that this will encourage them to prepare for careers in their chosen areas of study.

Each year, members of Founder Region contribute \$2.00 per member in the form of mandatory dues assessments. These funds are administered by the Fellowship Board. Clubs are encouraged to have fund raisers, called "Fun for Fellowship", and to support the program through becoming a "Fellow", with a donation of \$1,000.00 from a club or individual..
