

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Members of Founder Region,

Conference was a huge success with 260 members and guests attending events over 3 days. The venue at the Oakland Marriott City Center was lovely and the staff was very attentive to our needs. I had several comments from staff that they loved our mission of improving the lives of women and girls. And it is so much fun to be together in friendship.

Our Legislative Advocacy Committee put together a wonderful program about the "Sandwich Generation" and how to prepare our parents for their elder care and also on how to prepare our children for our elder care. It was fun, interesting and informative. Later Friday evening we had our Fellowship gala honoring 10 women receiving their PhDs with grants of \$10,075 each; the additional \$75 added to our customary \$10,000 award was to honor the 75th anniversary of our Fellowship program.

After our business meeting on Saturday, our board chose to break from tradition and have a more interactive program. Each director lined up a member from three of their clubs to give us a summary of one of their projects within the four pillars; it's always good for clubs to share ideas with other clubs. After lunch there was a very competitive game of "Soropardy" created by your District Directors. It was a lot of fun and a good learning tool.

Of course the highlight of our conference is the Sunday morning program. At our Memorial program this year we honored thirteen beloved Soroptimist members who passed on this last year. The tribute ended with



Laura Middlemiss beautifully singing "Hallelujah" which brought tears to many in the audience. We then had our awards program hosted by Governor-elect Elise presenting the Violet Richardson and Live Your Dream awards for each of our five districts.

We were fortunate to have SIA President-elect Bobbi Enderlin as our official visitor this year. As she is a Past Governor and Past Fellowship President in Founder Region, it was special because she knew so many members attending. I know she felt the love of her fellow Founder Region members as they welcomed her.






Coordinating a conference is a huge undertaking and there are many I want to thank:

Impact of Fellowship

Friday night at Conference was truly inspiring as Fellowship awarded 10 recipients with \$10,075 each for a total of \$100,750, the most ever given. One of the highlights was the keynote speaker, Dr. Eric Haas, Professor, Director of Ed Leadership Doctoral Program at CSU East Bav.

Eight recipients attended in person and felt the overwhelming support and empowerment from our Soroptimist members in attendance. One recipient sent in her video from Thailand and another from UC Berkeley.

To date, Founder Region Fellowship has provided 363 women with a little over 1.7 million dollars in funding to help them achieve their doctoral degrees. THOSE ARE SOME NUM-BERS OF WHICH WE CAN BE VERY PROUD!

We want to thank each and every one of you for supporting our fundraisers and for making donations either through monthly giving or direct donation to become a Fellow, or level up. Members supported our fundraising efforts during conference by spinning the Prize Wheel, buying bee bags, bee earrings and signing up for Monthly Giving. We thank you!

Dream It, Be It Update!

Clubs will be using a new Dream It, Be It
Reporting and Evaluation Form
starting July 1, 2023

SIA has spent the last two years testing and identifying ways to improve the form and are working on building it in all languages. Some questions will be streamlined (like the *demographic* ones asking if girls are supported at home, etc.); but otherwise, the form will not

be changed much. Clubs will get a copy of their submitted report and can edit it after submission, which will likely be a popular feature.

SIA will distribute the new reporting link, update the website, and send an email to all clubs once the switch is made (they don't want anyone getting confused before the change is official). As Founder Region Chair, I will be able to receive a copy of your report from SIA once it's submitted, a new feature I'm excited about.

Region Leadership Spotlight

I was born and raised in Washington D. C. I met my first husband, Jim who was stationed there in the Navy. We got married and moved to San Diego where I worked for the Pacific Telephone Co. in the Engineering Dept. When Jim got out of the Navy, we moved to Eureka where he had lived. We moved in Jan. of 1964 and it rained for 60 days straight. I started looking for directions to build an Ark. Our first son was born in San Diego and the second son in Eureka. Jim and I were half owners in the Green Lot Nursery started by his parents. Jim became an Arcata police officer and we no longer worked in the nursery. We decided to become foster parents and took in boys from the Probation Dept. We had 2 boys of our own and 6 foster boys.

After 14 years of marriage, Jim and I divorced. I

kept the house and our children and started taking foster children with disabilities. At this time I had my 2 boys, 2 girls and 2 boys

with learning disabilities. In 2002 I discontinued fostering. I have probably had nearly 100 kids during the 38 years I was a foster parent.

I narried my current husband in 1977. He had 2 children, and we have one daughter together. Because we had boys and girls both, we became 4-H Leaders, and we did that for 15 years. I was also a Girl Scout leader for my daughter's troop from 1985 until she graduated high school. I continued being a Girl Scout leader until 2020.

In 1980, my husband and a friend started a prehung door business. I worked with them part time. It was during this time that my ex-mother-in-law asked me to join her ladies lunch club. Working with men and dealing with men customers, I



thought it would be nice to have lunch once a week with women. This turned out to be Soroptimist. I have been a member for 33 years and have held every office except Treasurer, some more than once.

In 2002 I went to work for Girl Scouts. I was the Membership Executive for Humboldt and Del Norte Counties. I loved that job. Recruiting adults to lead troops and girls to become Girl Scouts. I retired in 2008.


